




Quarterly Wood Smoke Report

Advisories Summary

- Oct. 2022 saw 7 red days the most in one month since the ordinance has been in effect. The total red days for all past Oct-Mar seasons was 4.
- DEQ air quality advisories for wildfire smoke in the metro area coincided with all October issued red days.
- A total of 18 first violations were issued on red days in Q4.
- No advisories were issued during the County's winter state of emergency declaration in December.
- The program received and approved 37 exemptions.



Exchange Program Pilot Launch

Keep cozy without the health hazard! Multnomah County launched a wood burning device exchange program. Participating homeowners can receive a financial incentive for replacing their wood burning device. The incentive amounts are dependent on eligibility and household income.
