- No advisories were issued in May.
- June's yellow day advisory was the wood smoke program's first advisory driven by high ozone concentrations.
- No violations were issued during Q2.

2021- 2022 Winter Survey Results

A survey conducted in March 2022 received 1118 responses. The survey indicated the ordinance works:

- 82% of annual survey respondents are aware of the woodburning curtailment ordinance.
- Of survey respondents who burn wood, 81% of respondents indicated their wood burning behavior had changed (burned less) as a result of the advisories.
