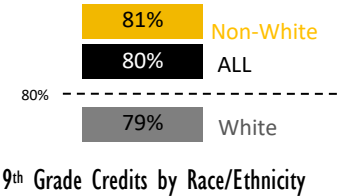

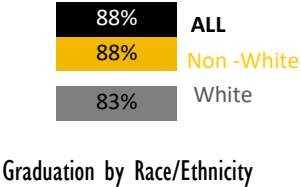
92.3% of students attended school regularly (90% of days)

ANTI-POVERTY/STABILITY SERVICES
Client engagement services, rent assistance and client assistance funds that support families to gain and maintain stable housing and increase their skills leading to increased income.

833 families, representing 2,844 individuals

88.8 % of families who received rent assistance remained in permanent housing 6 months after exit
