PROCLAMATION NO. 2024-051

Proclaiming June 15th, 2024 as Elder Abuse Awareness Day in Multnomah County, Oregon.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- A. Older adults deserve to be safe and should be treated with respect and dignity to enable them to serve as leaders, mentors, volunteers and thriving members of our communities.
- B. Elder Abuse Awareness Day is an opportunity for our community to raise awareness and promote a better understanding of the issue of abuse, neglect and self-neglect of older persons.
- C. Elder abuse is an issue that affects millions of seniors every year. It takes many forms, including physical abuse, verbal abuse, neglect, financial exploitation, and issues of self-neglect. Elder abuse may be perpetrated by family members, friends, caregivers and strangers.
- D. Recognizing and reporting abuse or concerns for the well being of older adults in our community is a responsibility shared by all of us. Providing education around recognizing the signs of abuse or self neglect and encouraging the public to share information with older adults is important to supporting their well being and safety.
- E. Effectively responding to elder abuse requires a connected and coordinated local services system. Collaboration throughout Multnomah County and the community are an important partnership that supports the well-being, safety and independence of our most vulnerable citizens.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Proclaims:

June 15, 2024 as Elder Abuse Awareness Day in Multnomah County. We encourage all agencies, advocates and citizens to recognize the importance of building a safe and inclusive community for older adults.
