Reminders and updates

- Washington County has decided to terminate their contract with Multnomah County due to cost (\$619/bed per day, compared with Marion County at \$226/bed per day; Yamhill county is also cheaper)
 - o This represents a \$2 million cut to our budget (11 beds)
 - o Our capacity is 40 beds, with 29 of those for Multnomah County

- o We currently have 38 youth in Detention
- o We are still an alternative emergency site for other Detention Centers
- o Questions:
 - For those who will no longer be coming to our facility, will they
 be receiving the same level of resources/services? ACTION: Kyla
 will share a document that outlines the services offered in
 Multnomah County's Detention
- Caleb Falconer Part of Corrections Health, has been invited to join the committee moving forward.
- o In Kyla's absence, Kate will be the chair of the committee. Senior Manager Silvia Gomes will be the JSD liaison.

Corrections Health Presentation (Caleb Falconer)

- The cost of medical services may contribute to why the cost is higher at Multnomah County's Detention
- Corrections Health (CH) provides
 - Intake support develop a plan of care for each youth (confirming medication regimen, detox services, STD and pregnancy screening, mental health screening)
 - o Distribution of medicine to youth
 - o Immunizations (COVID, flu etc.)
 - o Labs
 - Weekly clinic with provider
 - Weekly mental health provider (crisis management-focused, not restorative therapy)
 - o Weekly PT
 - Improve health literacy (so they know how to advocate for/ask for care that is needed)
 - o Support/education for guardians
- CH does not provide court-ordered therapies
