POLICY & PRACTICE: SFIR

Shots Fired Incident Report (SFIR)

• Every "shots fired" incident needs a report documenting how many shots were fired, associated locations, victims, suspects, and evidence collected.

Patrol resources complete the largest number of SFIR reports

POLICY & PRACTICE: NIBIN

- The National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBN) is a system that automates ballistic information by tracking spend shell casings submitted for analysis. NIBIN is managed by the ATF.
- Shell casings fired and ejected from a firearm have unique identifiers, which allow law enforcement to identify when a firearm is used in multiple gun violence events.

• PPB has our own NIBIN machine and are able to rapidly get information into NIBIN for quicker leads.

POLICY & PRACTICE: FIT & FIT COG

- The Focused Intervention Team (FIT) is our proactive unit tasked with helping interrupt gun violence cycles through data driven policing.
- FIT receives recommendations from the Community Oversight Group (COG)
- COG is an advisory group made up of community members appointed by City Council and the Mayor's Office to provide ongoing input into gun violence intervention and deterrence strategies used by FIT

POLICY & PRACTICE: ECST & HOMICIDE


- Non-fatal gun crimes are investigated by officers and detectives assigned to the Enhanced Community Safety Team (ECST)
- Fatal gun crimes are investigated by detectives assigned to the Homicide Detail
 - In 2022 we added a third team of six detectives to the Homicide Detail








