Welcome, Introductions, Agenda & Minutes Review	 Attendees introduced themselves April minutes were approved by consensus Syringe Services & Harm Reduction Report - see attached slides for more details 	Laurel Hansen	
Syringe Services Report	 Direct service data: syringe access and Naloxone distribution in the database We had the highest barrier for accessing Naloxone and have worked on addressing this barrier "Chime In Survey" - state survey that collects anonymous HIV information Main findings of the survey included a higher percentage of respondents using fentanyl, smoking drugs, and poly-substance use Fewer people are sharing injection equipment People are testing for HIV/HCV and syphilis less than in 2019; this is likely a correlation with the pandemic and people being unaware of testing options More people are moving away from injecting drugs to smoking drugs due to availability in drug supply Recommendations: Maintain 1:1 needs-based model of distribution for syringe access as it decreases sharing of injection equipment Provide supplies for other routes of administration as it increases engagement, reduces transmission rates of certain STDs, and reduce soft-tissue infections caused by injection Increase access and availability to low barrier HIV/STD testing - some methods allow for immediate results as well as testing that doesn't require a blood sample Improve integration/coordination with culturally-specific BIPOC providers Support legislative efforts to amend drug paraphernalia laws which remove restrictions to access drug checking supplies Assess feasibility of an overdose prevention site/safe consumption site Benefits of these sites: no fatal overdoses, reduces crime, and less syringe debris lying around In Canada, the day center is integrated with the integration center Establish LGBTQIA+ affirming services to integrate harm reduction supplies<td>Kim Toevs, Andy Cho</td>	Kim Toevs, Andy Cho
