

The Who and The What

Who qualifies:

- Unpaid caregivers caring for someone in their life 60 and older
- Unpaid caregivers caring for someone in their life diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's (the person in care can be any age)
- Unpaid caregivers over the age of 55 caring for a child age 18 and younger.
- Unpaid caregivers over the age of 55 caring for someone in their life who is disabled and age 18 or older.

What do you get:

- Case management-if you want it, but it's not required to access other parts of the program
- Access to free support groups
- The Relief grant- for either Respite of 12 hours a month provided by an in home agency or 4 visits a month to an adult day center. OR for goods and services.
- Access to free caregiver trainings.
- Access to caregiver resources and Caregiver specific community events.
