PROCLAMATION NO. 2024-028

Proclaiming April 28, 2024 as Workers' Memorial Day in Multnomah County, Oregon.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- A. Workers' Memorial Day is a day to remember those who have suffered and died on the job and rededicate ourselves to the fight for safe workplaces.
- B. Fifty-six Oregonians died on the job, from injuries sustained while working, or in service to the United States of America in 2023.
- C. We remember those who have died in workplace catastrophes, suffered diseases due to exposure to toxic substances or been injured because of dangerous conditions.
- D. More than 50 years ago on April 28 the Occupational Safety and Health Act went into effect, promising every worker the right to a safe job—a fundamental right; the law was won because of the tireless efforts of the labor movement, which organized for safer working conditions and demanded action from the government to protect working people.
- E. By organizing Workers Memorial Day on April 28, a day chosen by the unions of the Oregon AFL-CIO as a day to remember the victims of workplace injuries and disease; renew efforts to seek stronger safety and health protection, better standards and enforcement, and fair and just compensation; and rededicate ourselves to improving safety and health in every American workplace, concerned Americans are determined to prevent these tragedies in the future.

April 28, 2024 as Workers' Memorial Day in Multnomah County, Oregon.
