1.	Safety and well-being of pets in our care.	Animal Enrichment	Besides ongoing enrichment activities, MCAS is developing a communication plan. Once this is complete this project will be moved to an ongoing operational program.	
2.	Policy and procedure standardization and accountability.	Behavior Documentation	Process improvement work is ongoing to ensure that the work is being done to standards.	
3.	Culture/change management and transparency.	Informational Hub	The second retreat for managers to review policies is scheduled for 10/16/24 to review high priority policy updates.

9.	Culture/change management/transparency.	Foster Program Updates	MCAS will be onboarding a second full-time foster staff, due to FY 2025 budget increases. The foster program is being reassessed to accommodate additional staff.
