- Energy Conservation (i.e. computer power management; energy efficient lighting; Energy Star electronics))
- Water Conservation (i.e. low flow faucets; high efficiency laundry equipment; low water landscaping plans)
- Waste Management and Reduction (i.e. e-waste recycling, composting program; paper reduction; buying in bulk)
- Alternative Fuels and Transportation Options (i.e. commuting options; bus pass program; hybrid electric vehicles; fuel efficient vehicles)
- [Sustainable Purchasing (i.e. recycled content products; green cleaning products; local food)
- Avoiding single use/disposable items (i.e. refillable products, durable items)
- Specifying items with reusable components
- Items made from recycled content (i.e. Postconsumer content paper products, plastics, furniture)
- Specifying alternatives that do not require hazardous waste disposal - if available
- Recyclable in local facilities and/or can be remanufactured
- Packaging reduction
- Toxics Reduction (i.e. no BPA, avoid asthmagens, reproductive toxins)
- Low emission products (i.e. materials or products that offgas like formaldehyde and paints)
- Specifying third party certified products (ie. FSC certified wood or paper, Green Seal cleaning products)
- Using LEED standards for specifications
