Caption: Parkrose School Bond To Upgrade Facilities, Replace Middle School

Question: Shall District renovate and upgrade facilities, replace middle school, improve safety, technology by issuing \$63,000,000 in general obligation bonds? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: Passage of this measure provides funds to finance capital costs at Parkrose facilities. This measure would:

- Increase access to technology for student learning by upgrading technology and related infrastructure at all facilities.
- 
- Replace roofs, upgrade plumbing, electrical systems and floors.
- 
- Increase energy efficiency by upgrading heating and ventilation systems and replacing windows.
- Make health, life, safety upgrades in all facilities such as security cameras and entry upgrades to meet safety standards and asbestos removal.
- Replace and equip Parkrose Middle School on the same site.
- Construct and equip multipurpose rooms for activities for elementary school students.
- Purchase property.
- Pay bond issuance costs.

The District's 1995 general obligation bond levy expires in December 2011 and it is anticipated that property taxes for this proposed bond levy would remain at the current tax rate.

Bonds would mature in 30 years or less from their date of issuance and may be issued in one or more series. The bond measure is not expected to increase the District's current property tax rate.

Caption: Portland Public Schools Bonds To Update, Renovate Local School Buildings

Question: Shall PPS update, rebuild, increase safety at public schools; retire debt; issue \$548 million in general obligation bonds, audit spending? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: Portland Public Schools buildings average 65 years old. Safety, security, classrooms and technology are out of date in nearly every building.

Bond funds support capital projects at 95 schools:

- 86 schools receive updates such as:
  - o Fire and life safety;
  - o Electrical, plumbing, lighting, roofing, heating, security;
  - o Earthquake safety, handicapped accessibility;
  - o Modern science classrooms;
  - o Classroom teaching technology;
  - o School grounds, exteriors, fields.
  
- 9 schools rebuilt:
  - o N/NE Portland: Roosevelt High; Faubion, Rigler, Laurelhurst
  - o SE Portland: Cleveland High; Marysville
  - o West Portland: Markham Elementary, East Sylvan on West Sylvan campus
  - o Middle College Program with Portland Community College at Jefferson High.
  
- Planning, design to prepare for rebuilding Lincoln High.

Bond funds will retire existing school projects debt.

Citizen oversight and annual audits of bond projects and expenditures are required.

Most bonds mature in 1 - 3 years to minimize interest expense. Cost estimated to be approximately \$2 per \$1,000 assessed property value for six years, then reduced. Median homeowner pays \$300 annually for six years, reduced to approximately \$22 annually.

Caption: Portland Public Schools Levy For Teachers And Educational Programs

Question: Shall schools protect class size, teaching positions; levy \$1.99 per \$1,000 assessed value for five years beginning 2011; require oversight?

This measure may cause property taxes to increase by more than three percent.

Summary: Portland Public Schools' voter-approved local option levy currently provides funding for retaining teachers and providing instructional programs that students need for a well-rounded education. As PPS responds to substantial cuts in state funding to local schools, continuing a local option will:

- Fund 600 teaching positions (some in every school), including 200 that would be lost in the coming school year due to state budget cuts without levy funds;
- Prevent substantial increases in class size so students receive more individual attention from teachers;
- Continue educational programs necessary for a well-rounded education.

Levy cost is \$1.99 per \$1,000 assessed property value of which \$1.25 per \$1,000 assessed property value is currently being paid. Typical home currently pays \$15.36 per month which would be replaced by payment of \$24.45 a month for five years.

No levy funds go to administration. Independent citizen oversight will review expenditures so funds are used as approved by voters.

The levy will produce an estimated \$57 million in 2011-12; \$58 million in 2012-13; \$62 million in 2013-14; \$65 million in 2014-15; and \$66 million in 2015-16.

### SCAPPOOSE RURAL FIRE

Measure NO : 5-212

Caption: Five-Year Local Option Levy Renewal for Personnel And Equipment

Question: Should Scappoose Fire District renew its \$0.94 levy and continue to provide the same emergency service it has since 2007? *This measure renews current local option taxes.*

Summary: A "yes" vote on this levy would retain the current paid firefighter/paramedic positions. District residents will see no change in emergency service or levy rate. The District presently has 3 paid personnel on duty 24-hours per day to respond to fire and medical emergencies. This staffing allows the district to respond immediately with the first emergency ambulance with paramedics. The second emergency will still require volunteers to respond to the station for fire and medical incidents.

The permanent tax rate alone is inadequate to properly ensure fire and ambulance service. Our community continues to have a demand for emergency fire and medical response. Combining the permanent tax rate with a 5-year levy has allowed the District to provide adequate staffing since 2007. We are optimistic that the \$0.94 levy renewal rate can continue to provide sufficient staffing until 2017.

This levy will begin after the expiration of the present levy 6/30/2012. The levy rate of \$0.94 on a home with an assessed value of \$150,000 would be \$141 per year for 5 years.

*The proposed rate will raise approximately \$953,696 in 2012/13, \$971,770 in 2013/14, \$992,225 in 2014/15, \$1,012,069 in 2015/16 and \$1,032,311 in 2016/17. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an estimate only based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate.*
