SUN Spotlight

Vernon's summer program has been one of the most active summers for Vernon student's since becoming a SUN Community School. Through community strong school and partnerships, we were able to offer a variety of camps to serve 81 students and 14 adults in our 4 summer programs. Camps ranged from a two week Garden STEAM Camp, a four week Academic Enrichment Camp, a one week Audubon Nature Camp and finally a three week Early Kindergarten Transition camp for both parents and children. Summer is traditionally a high risk time for kids who may not have anything to do during the day, but with partners like Portland State University, Audubon Society, Portland Public Multnomah County, Enhancement and many others working together to offer kids something positive to do with their time, we can make an impact on students even during the long summer months. Vernon is truly a School that is uniting the Vernon neighborhood.
