Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 347 students; Grades 6-8; 100% Eligible for Free Meals;
78% Students of Color (African American 25%, American Indian/AK Native 1%, Asian 6%, Hispanic 36%, Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander 3%, Multiple Race 7%, White 22%)

62% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading *

53% of students increased benchmark scores in Math *

Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was **92%**
