### Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

## Evaluation

### Outputs

#### 314 youth served

83% students of color

88% identified as being “at risk of academic failure”

100% qualified for free and reduced lunch

#### 50 adults served

#### 740 people served in non-enrollment events

(family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

### Outcomes

77% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading \*

74% of students increased benchmark scores in Math \*

Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was 88%

## SUN Spotlight

This year at SUN will be all about exposure for the students. There are so many activities and avenues for the students to explore, and without SUN, some may never have the opportunity to experience. During the first term, *Circus Project* taught acrobatics, juggling, creative movement, coordination skills, and kinesthetic awareness. *Hollywood Theaters-Animate It* was a class offered to the middle school population, showing them stop motion video and how to create a video production including lighting, composition, storyboarding, shooting, and editing. *4-H Farm, Food and Fitness* offered students the opportunity to explore selection, preparation, cooking and enjoying healthy delicious foods. *S.E.L.F.* was another class offered to provide exposure to colleges and what it takes financially, academically, and mentally to be successful and prepared.

The partnerships that have been developed to create the exposure opportunities for the students have been amazing. We are excited and looking forward to continuous growth of classes and opportunities for the Boise-Eliot Humboldt students.
