Hartley Elementary School

Lead Agency: Metropolitan Family Service

Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 541 students; Grades K-5; 100% Eligible for Free Meals; 78% Students of Color (African American 10%, American Indian/AK Native <1%, Asian 3%, Hispanic 54%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 4%, Multiple Race 6%, White 22%)

Evaluation 2013-14

Outputs

261 youth served

79% students of color 94% identified as being "at risk of academic failure" 84% gualified for free and reduced lunch

60 adults served

2388 people served in non-enrollment events (family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

Outcomes

83% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading **96%** of students increased benchmark scores in Math **Average daily attendance** of SUN CS students was **95%**

According to teachers, of students who regularly attended SUN CS:

74% improved classroom academic performance

66% improved getting homework in on time

73% participated in class more

70% improved behavior

78% came to school more motivated to learn

SUN Success Story

The Hartley Parent Welcome Night for the school year 2014-2015 was a great success and a wonderful example of the collaborative spirit of SUN. At the beginning of the school year, the students and families were invited to meet their teachers and school staff. There was food and snacks in addition to a Resource Fair that was orchestrated by SUN. The night played out like a scavenger hunt, with each family checking in with all the important and relevant parties: teacher, principal, secretaries, specials teachers, SUN staff and classmates. Over 300 families attended this night and there was plenty for them to do. Most families stayed over the time period that was planned and they all left with smiles. This event was made possible with collaboration from school administration and staff, the MFS SUN Site Manager and AmeriCorps member and several community partners.
