Criminalization vs. Care

In December 2022, four organizations (Communities United, Movimiento Poder, Reimagine Richmond, and Social Movement Support Lab) came together to examine the budgets of 20 US cities / counties to explore if the investments focused on the criminal system or systems of care. 

Criminalizing Poverty

A 2022 study in Oklahoma County found that "fines and fees contributed to a criminalization of low-income defendants, placing them at risk of ongoing court involvement through new warrants and debt collection." While Multnomah County partners have worked diligently to decrease fines and fees, it is important to reiterate the need to continually mitigate the negative financial consequences that do not lead to wellness, recovery, and better public safety.
