Community Corrections Plan and SB 1145 State Grant-In-Aid

- 1995's SB 1145 transferred community corrections to counties
- Governed by Community Corrections Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) & Community Corrections Plan (CCP) for **supervision, sanctions** and **services**.
- DCJ's FY 2026 Adopted Budget utilized the Governor's Recommended Budget to determine the SB 1145 State Grant in Aid funding levels.
- Community Corrections **significantly underfunded**
- Funds the Local Public Safety Coordinating Council (2%), remainder funding DCJ's ASD (65%) and the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office for local control jail beds (35%)

Total reduction of ~\$4.1 for Multnomah County FY2026

~\$2.6M for Adult Services
