





TARGETED STRATEGY EXAMPLE

Every community member is resilient to extreme weather and climate threats

Plant trees and build shade structures in areas most affected by heat

Create and/or fund program. Advocacy.

Multnomah County, participating cities

No deaths and min illnesses during extreme heat events.

Disaggregated data by race and income.

Community data on access to shade and cooling.

WHO CAN USE THE PLAN?

Community

- Support neighborhood and community-wide actions.
- Strengthen capacity for collective action.
- Facilitate collaboration among community organizations for projects and policy advocacy.

Multnomah County

- Advance County actions within span of control.
- Prioritize implementation in partnership with the community.
- Inform government policies and resource allocation to address climate change.
