It does not increase the current limit on borrowing. The measure clarifies that community colleges and public universities may purchase existing buildings with the proceeds of general obligation bonds. It also allows the Oregon University System to use nontax revenues to determine whether bonds to be issued under Article XI-F(1) are self-supporting. The measure allows Article XI-F(1) and XI-G bond proceeds to be used for the same parts of a project and to be used for mixed-use projects that benefit higher education. It allows nontax revenues to be used as matching funds for Article XI-G bond proceeds.</p>

<p><input type="radio"/> LaVonne Griffin-Valade</p>	<p>Result of "no" vote: "No" vote retains current law prohibiting state and restricting local districts from issuing bonds to pay for school capital costs, including acquisition, construction, repair and improvement.</p>	<p>Question: Shall Sauvie Island Volunteer Rural Fire Protection District #30J impose a continuing \$0.4600 per \$1,000.00 of assessed value for five years for operating purposes beginning 2010-2011? This measure renews current local option taxes.</p>
<p><input type="radio"/> _____ Write-in</p>	<p>Summary: This measure would revise the Oregon Constitution to allow voters to approve local district bonds for school capital costs and the state to issue bonds and use the revenue from those bonds to help local school districts pay for capital costs. The Constitution currently limits voters' ability to approve local district bonds for school capital costs and prevents the state from issuing bonds to help local districts pay for school capital costs. "Capital costs" include costs for acquisition, construction, repair and improvement, but not routine maintenance or supplies. State funds may be used only to match funds approved by voters in local districts. The measure would dedicate 15 percent of state lottery revenues to a "school capital matching fund" to repay state funds provided to districts. State bonds may not be repaid by raising property taxes. Contains other provisions.</p>	<p>Summary: The taxes proposed will be used for general operating purposes for the Sauvie Island R.F.P.D. #30J. Anticipated uses of funds include: state required medical testing for all firefighters, required Federal and OSHA testing of equipment and of firefighters use of equipment, physical testing of firefighters and their abilities, annual servicing and safety inspections of vehicles and equipment, including funds for replacement, and continuing volunteer training and certification. The rate is estimated to raise the following amounts: \$60,720. in 2010/2011, \$61,934.00 in 2011/2012, \$63,173.00 in 2012/2013, \$64,437.00 in 2013/2014 and \$65,725. in 2014/2015.</p>

26-107 Adoption of New Charter by the City of Maywood Park.

Question: Shall the City adopt a new City Charter?

Summary: The current Charter was enacted in 1970 and has had no revisions since that time. The current Charter is therefore outdated and limits the City's ability to borrow money and levy taxes to benefit the City and ensure its continued existence. In order to operate more efficiently, the City is proposing a new Charter, which has been drafted by the City Council and includes provisions to better protect citizens and to allow the City to serve the community to a fuller extent. This ballot measure must be voted on and passed by Maywood Park voters in order to allow the City to adopt the new Charter.
