A Message from your Reynolds School Board –

Join Us in Voting for Safe, Secure and Repaired Reynolds Schools!

As your elected School Board, we unanimously placed this bond on the ballot because Reynolds students deserve schools that are secure, well-maintained, and ready for the future.

As your elected Reynolds School Board, we made sure that any ask put before voters would NOT be a tax increase. We're asking you to renew an existing bond, not approve a new tax.

What you pay today, you will continue to pay. \$0.00 rate increase.

This renewal lets us repair, secure, and replace the school buildings our community already invested in.

- **Repair**

Roofs, HVAC systems, plumbing, and electrical systems across the district are aging and failing. This bond funds the infrastructure repairs our schools need now, before small problems become expensive emergencies.

- **Secure**

Several fire safety systems across the district need replacement. Many school facilities are overdue for ADA accessibility upgrades too. This bond funds both, so every student and every visitor can safely access our schools.

- **Replace**

Glenfair Elementary is 72 years old. Replacement is simply more cost efficient than repair for this aging building. Its building and security systems are failing, and in several areas, the school is overcrowded; one student bathroom serves over 250 kids! This bond replaces Glenfair with a modern, safe building built for the students who attend it today.

Passing this measure also makes Reynolds eligible for \$8,168,000 in state matching funds, money we cannot receive unless voters approve this renewal.

Every dollar is subject to independent audits and School Board and citizen budget committee oversight. Funds go directly to classrooms and teaching, not administration.

This is a renewal. It does not raise your taxes. Please join us in voting YES on Measure 26-268.

Reynolds Taxpayers: A Responsible Renewal, Not a New Tax

Let's start with the number that matters most: \$0.00.

That's the rate increase under Measure 26-268. **What you pay today, you'll keep paying tomorrow. This is a renewal, not a new tax.**

What changes is what that money accomplishes. Reynolds school buildings are aging, with failing roofs, HVAC systems, plumbing, and electrical systems across the district.

- **Fixes the Basics:** Deferred maintenance doesn't stay cheap. It gets more expensive the longer it waits, until a planned repair turns into an emergency. Renewing this bond lets the district address these problems on a responsible timeline, at a cost taxpayers are already covering.
- **Unlocks Matching Funds:** This measure also makes Reynolds eligible for \$8,168,000 in state matching funds, money that will go to another district if voters don't renew this bond.
- **Oversight Required:** Accountability is written into the ballot language, and the district can't opt out of it. Every dollar is subject to independent audits and oversight from the School Board and a citizen budget oversight committee. Funds go to buildings and repairs, not administration.

This isn't a blank check. It's a plan with real numbers behind every project, and it keeps our schools functional without adding a single cent to the rate taxpayers pay today.
