











**Notes**: The number of County Health Clinic visits increased for insured patients but remained the same for uninsured patients. The number of ADS Help Line calls declined over last month, but still remains high. The number of Domestic Violence Crisis Line calls continues to decline, and is the lowest since March 2007. The number of bed days per 1000 for mental health Verity-only patients remained low—only slightly higher than last month's record low. This decline can be explained by increased availability for clients to 24-hour respite care in lieu of hospitalization.









**Notes**: The number of developmental disability (DD) service contacts decreased, and is the lowest since July 2007. Most of the decline is due to a drop in total targeted service notes. The number of average daily protective services investigations opened for ADS clients has increased over the past two months. The number of rental assistance and voucher recipients has steadily increased since May 2007.
