

## **MULTNOMAH COUNTY JAIL STATISTICS: OCTOBER 2007**

## **Key Statistics**<sup>1</sup>:

- → The total number of average daily filled jail beds: 1544²
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively under the contract with U.S. Marshal's Office<sup>3</sup>: **127** The number of billed jail beds<sup>4</sup> under USM contract: **125**
- → The average daily jail beds filled under SB1145 (Local Control population): 212
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively by Parole or Probation violations: **369**
- → The number of Emergency Population Releases: 0
- → The number of inmates on field based work release (FBWR) caseload<sup>5</sup>: 11. The number of jail bed days saved due to FBWR: 140 (equivalent to 4.5 jail beds).
- → The number of inmates referred to treatments: **27**. The number of inmates placed into treatments: **16**. Average number of inmates on November treatment waiting list: **46**.
