

MULTNOMAH COUNTY JAIL STATISTICS: SEPTEMBER 2007

Key Statistics¹:

- → The total number of average daily filled jail beds: 1605²
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively under the contract with U.S. Marshal's Office³: **126** The number of billed jail beds⁴ under USM contract: **130**
- → The average daily jail beds filled under SB1145 (Local Control population): 212
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively by Parole or Probation violations: 420
- → The average daily jail beds filled under <u>Portland 57 Project</u>: **53**. A total of **296** unduplicated P57 inmates were in custody during the month.
- → The number of Emergency Population Releases: 85
- → The number of inmates referred to the treatments: **30**. The number of inmates placed into the treatments: **23**
- → The average number of inmates on October treatment waiting list: **56** (*monthly average based on the weekly reports received in October*).

¹ This data sheet is provided mainly to meet the reporting requirements as specified in one of the FY 2008 Budget Notes.

² This represents 98.3% of total County operational jail bed capacity (N=1633). Capacity at 97% or higher is considered a Population Emergency. In-transit bookings were excluded from the total bed use calculation.

³ This number does not include 22 non-exclusive USM beds that were reported in other categories.

⁴ The number of billed USM beds is a result of negotiation and data reconciliation between the County and US Marshal's office. It may not be the same number as pulled out from the DSSJ system.

⁵ Beds used for SB1145 (based on primary offenses) and BM11 (based on primary offenses) were counted first regardless other types of holding an inmate might have.
