

MULTNOMAH COUNTY JAIL STATISTICS: AUGUST 2007 DRAFT

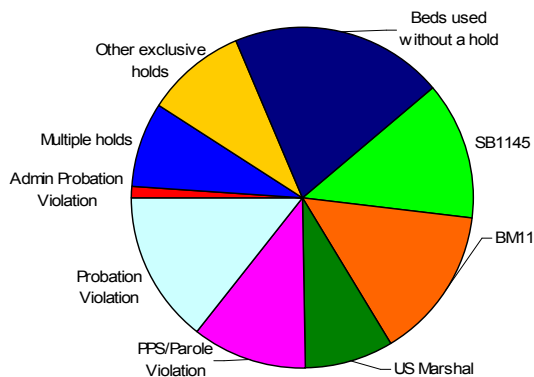
Key Statistics¹:

- The total number of average daily filled jail beds: **1611**²
- The average daily jail beds filled exclusively under the contract with U.S. Marshal's Office³: **132** The number of billed jail beds⁴ under USM contract: **141**
- The average daily jail beds filled exclusively by Parole or Probation violations: **428**
- The average daily jail beds filled under Portland 57 Project: **53**. A total of **315** unduplicated P57 inmates were in custody during the month.
- The number of Emergency Population Releases:**108**
- The number of inmates referred to the treatments: **40**. The number of inmates placed into the treatments: **21**
- The average number of inmates on September treatment waiting list: **67** (*monthly average based on the weekly reports received in September*).

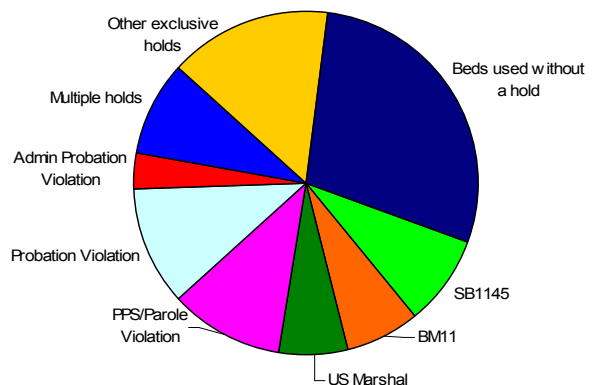

¹ This data sheet is provided mainly to meet the reporting requirements as specified in one of the FY 2008 Budget Notes.
² This represents 98.7% of total County operational jail bed capacity (N=1633). Capacity at 97% or higher is considered a Population Emergency. In-transit bookings were excluded from the total bed use calculation.
³ This number does not include 26 non-exclusive USM beds that were reported in other categories.
⁴ The number of billed USM beds is a result of negotiation and data reconciliation between the County and US Marshal's office. It may not be the same number as pulled out from the DSSJ system.
⁵ Beds used for SB1145 and BM11 were counted first regardless other types of holding an inmate might have.
