
## **MULTNOMAH COUNTY JAIL STATISTICS: JULY 2007**

## **Key Statistics**<sup>1</sup>:

- $\rightarrow$  The total number of average daily filled jail beds: 1602<sup>2</sup>
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively under the contract with U.S. Marshal's Office<sup>3</sup>: 128 The number of billed jail beds<sup>4</sup> under USM contract: 138
- $\rightarrow$  The average daily jail beds filled exclusively by parole violations: 172
- → The average daily jail beds filled under <u>Portland 57 Project</u>: **54**. A total of **306** unduplicated P57 inmates were in custody during the month.
- → The number of Emergency Population Releases: 63
- → The number of inmates referred to the treatments: **35**. The number of inmates placed into the treatments: **15**
- → The average number of inmates on treatment waiting list in August: **68** (*monthly average based on the weekly reports received in August*).
