











Notes: Average Daily Reported Offenses increased due to increases in *Assault, Theft and Property Crimes* in Portland. Average Daily Arrests increased slightly due to more *Other* category arrests. Average Daily Bookings increased slightly, mainly due to increases in bookings for *Misdemeanor-level Person and Property charges*. The MCSO reported 285 matrix releases (average 9.5 per day), the lowest since December 2004. Average length of stay (ALS) was 17.75, almost a day longer than May's ALS.









Notes. The DA Adult Cases Received increased by more than 300—the highest since June 2004—due to increases in all categories except *Person offenses*. The decline in Adult Supervision has leveled off to roughly a 9,100 caseload per month. The Juvenile Justice caseload shows little overall change for the past several months. Court outcomes saw large increases in resolved cases likely due to the continued processing of outdated misdemeanor warrants.
