


Multnomah County: Reported Index Offenses



*The graph reflects the combined weekly index offenses data from Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and Gresham Police Dept (GPD), beginning 8/2004 (line in **hlue**). PPB and GPD account for 94% of all offenses county-wide. Index offenses account for about half of all reported offenses.


Average Daily Reported Index Offenses*



Average Daily Arrests by Primary Crime Type


Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only)

Average Daily Arrests: April 2005




Sheriff: Bookings

Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds




Notes: Average Daily Reported Offenses has remained relatively consistent since January; April showed a slight increase in reported *Auto Theft* in both Portland and Gresham. Average Daily Arrests decreased for all categories except *Vehicle/DUII* and *Other* offenses. Average Daily Bookings to continue to be elevated; April increased, mainly due to standard bookings for *Property* offenses. The MCSO reported 612 matrix releases (average 20.4 per day).



Community Supervision: Adult Caseloads





Notes. The DA Adult cases received decreased by 285 cases—due to decreases in all offense categories except *Property* (up 4%, to 32% of all received cases). Adult Supervision caseloads increased slightly overall over last month due to increases in *Specialized* and *Non-Specialized cases* (RST declined). Juvenile caseload was up for medium-risk supervision, but down for high and low-risk youth in March, averaging a total of 24 cases per counselor.
