


PUBLIC SAFETY BRIEF: JANUARY 2004



Notes. A dramatic drop occurred in the average daily number of reported crimes coinciding with the ice storm (1/4-1/10/04); the decline was due to reductions in reported property crimes (theft, auto theft, burglary).

The average daily bookings continued their decline from 87 to 83; A&D bookings decreased for the first time since June 2003. The average daily custody population increased from 1629 to 1654; system capacity increased by 60 work-release beds for an *average* daily system capacity of 1725.





Notes. The District Attorney's adult caseload continued its unusual decline; detailed data is still pending the CRIMES-DSSJ interface. We were unable to determine which case types may have decreased. The number of total active adult supervision cases also continued to fall from 9,392 to 9,334.

The Juvenile Diversion Unit was disbanded in December; some cases were shifted to other caseloads where appropriate. All service categories increased except FAA; the two largest increases in juvenile caseloads were in gender specific and GRIT.
