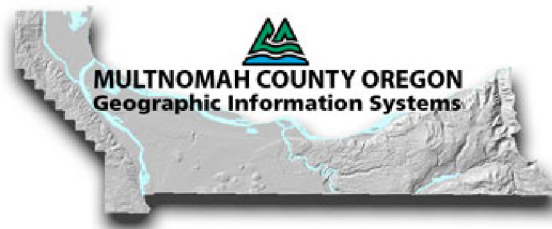


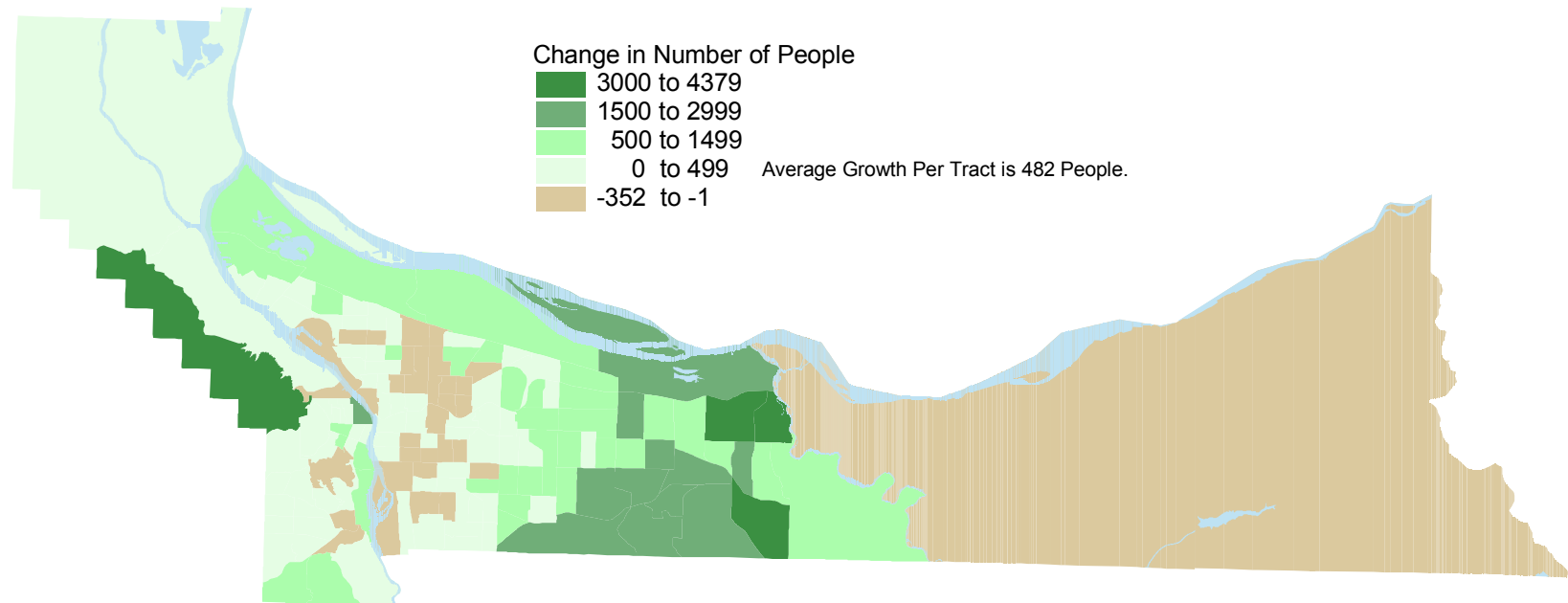

Maps of Demographic Changes 1990 to 2000



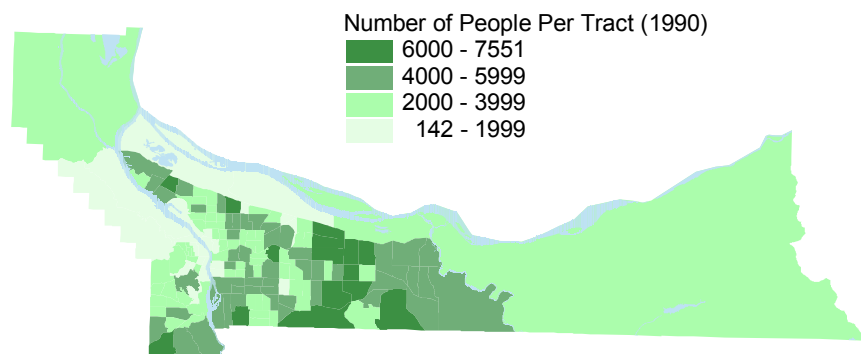

Change in the Number of People from 1990 to 2000

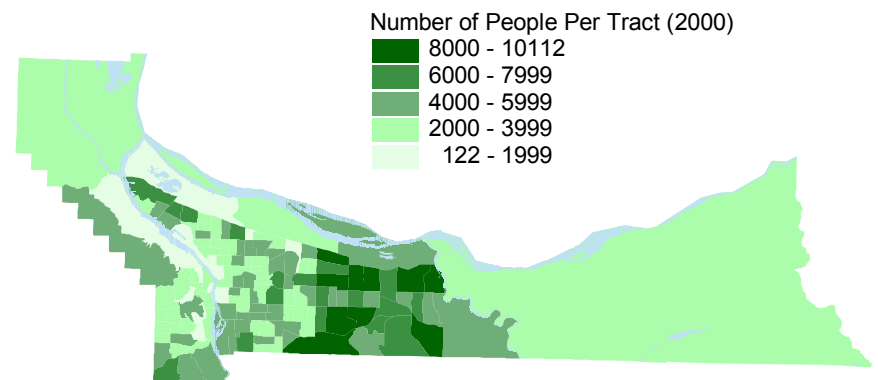

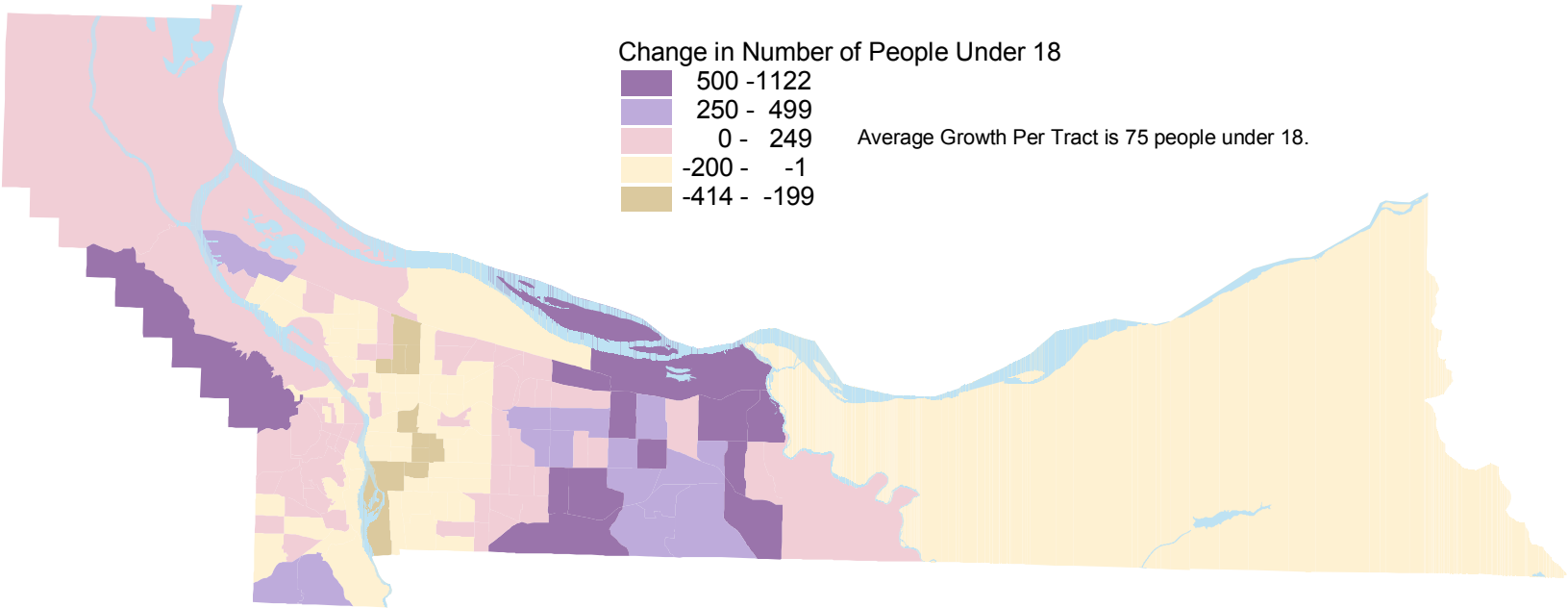

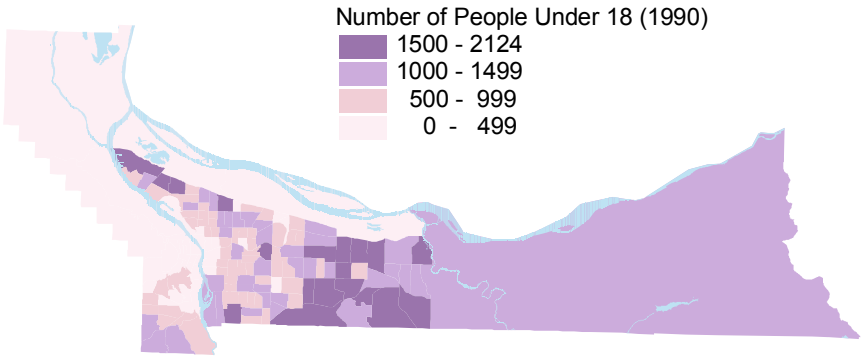


Change in the Number of People Under 18 from 1990 to 2000

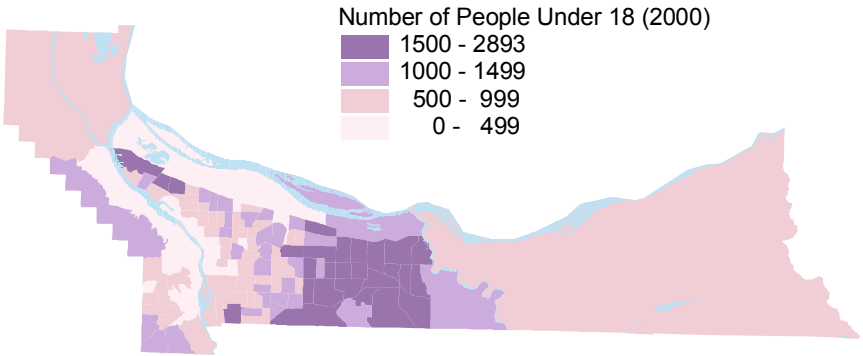

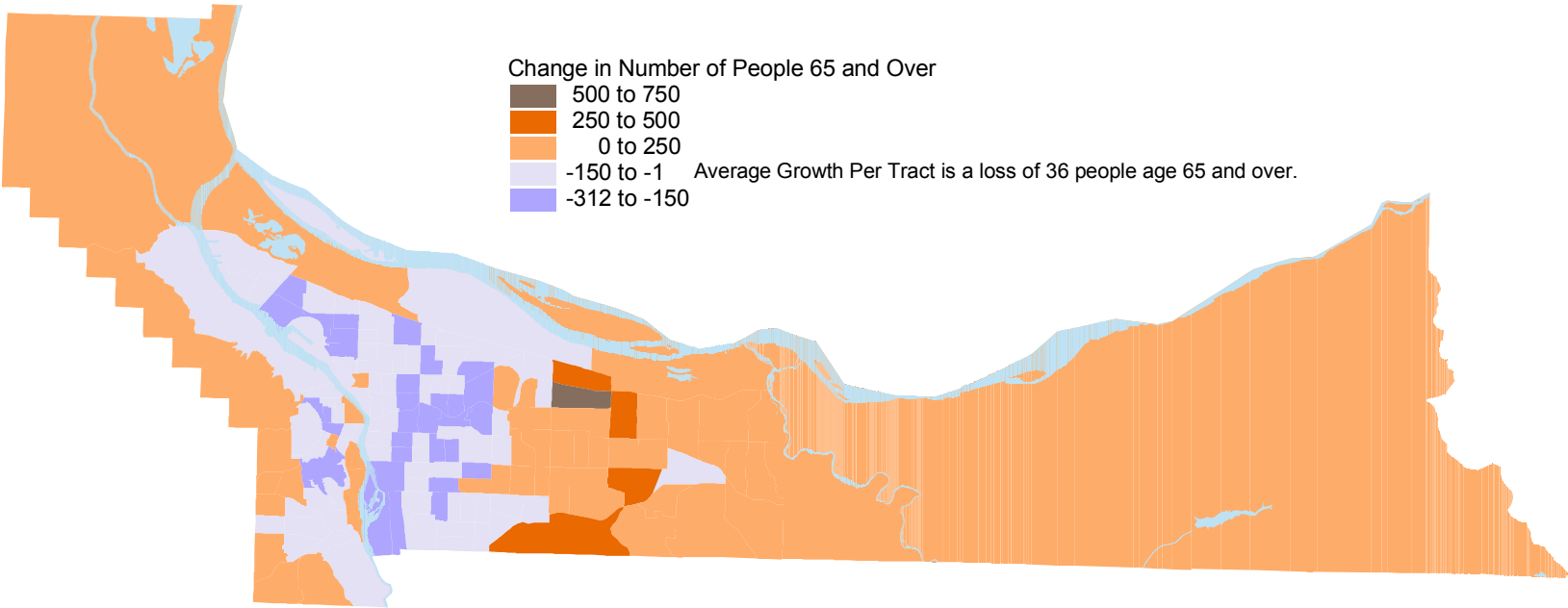

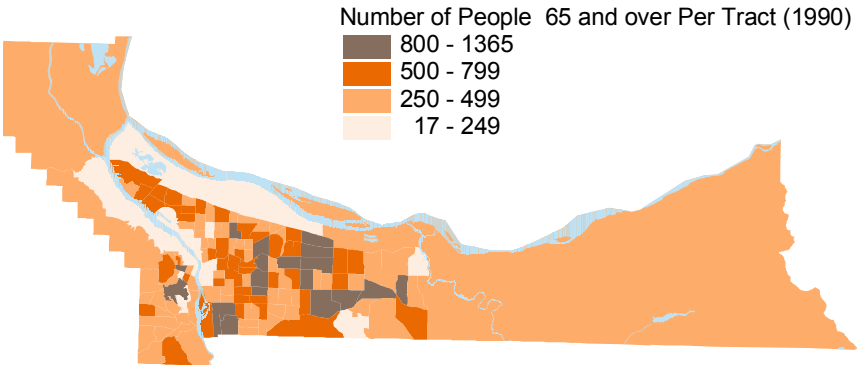


Change in the Number of People 65 and Over from 1990 to 2000

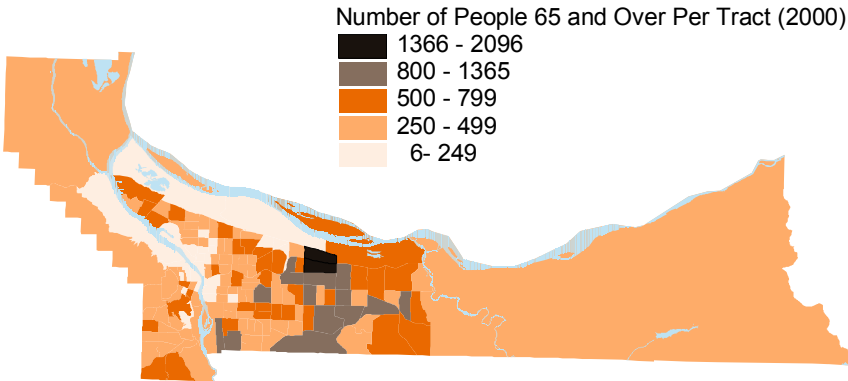

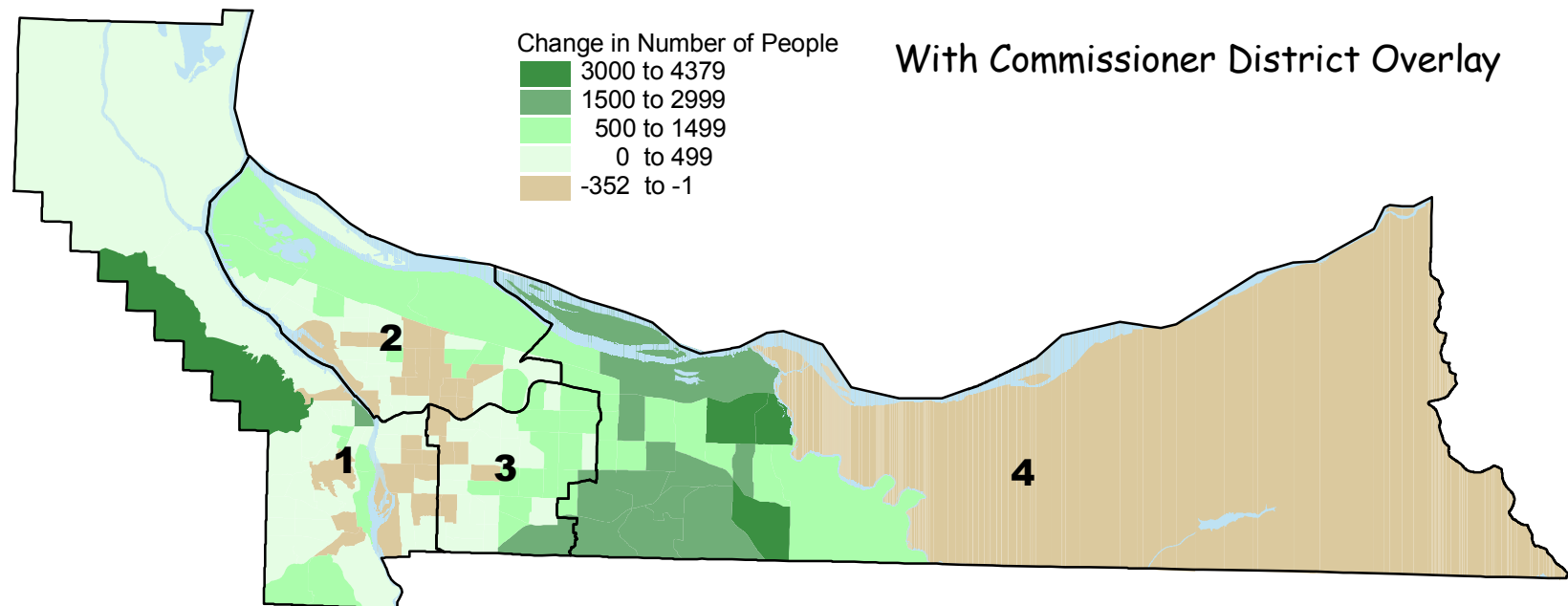

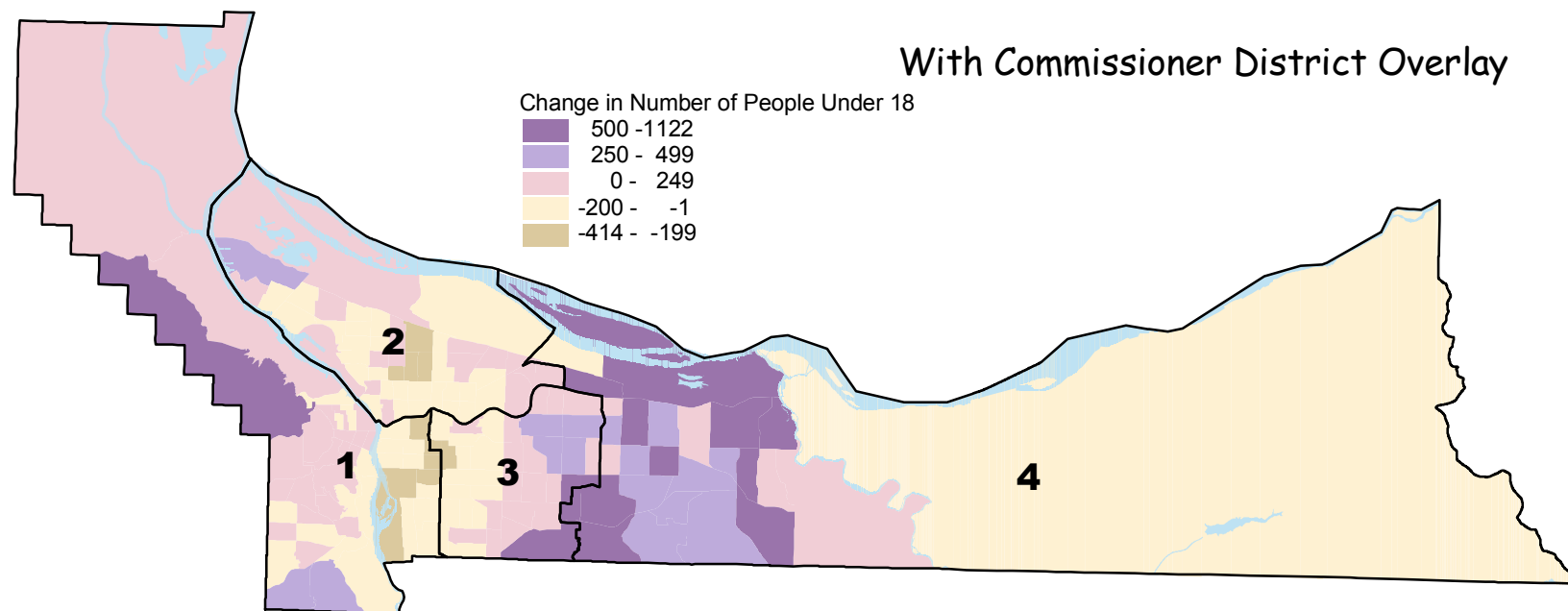
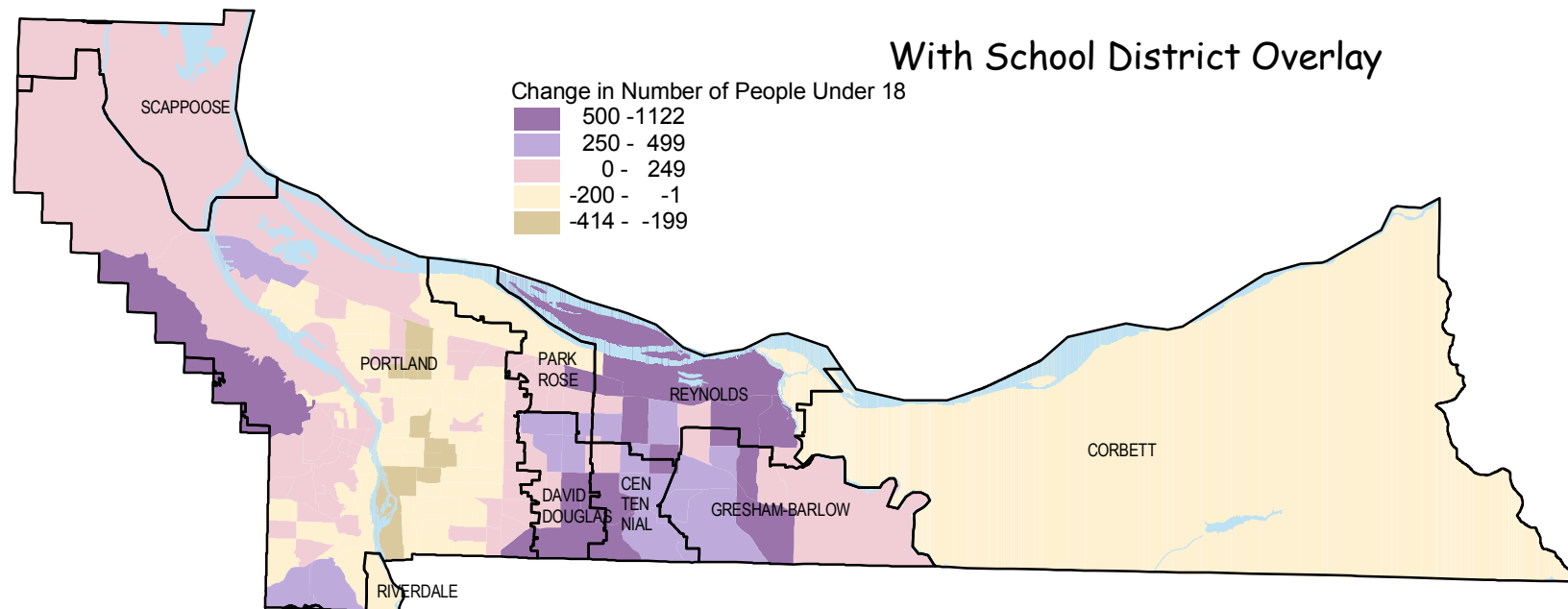

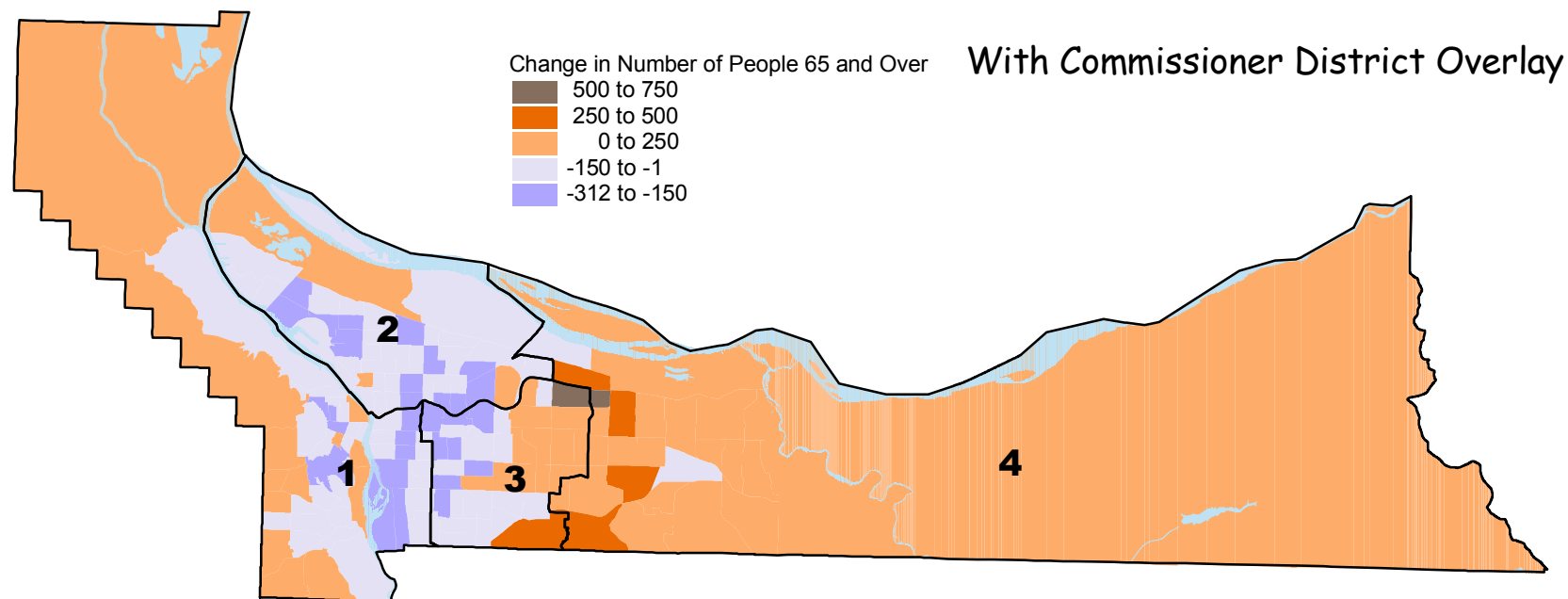
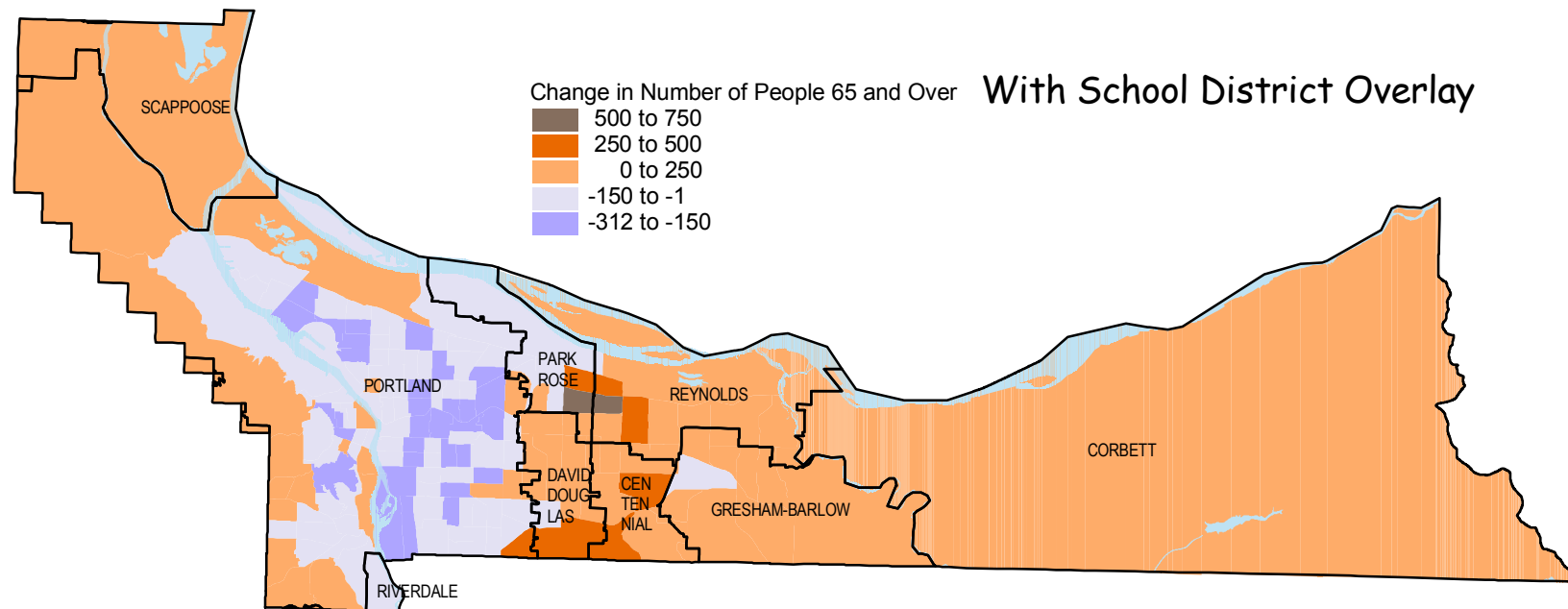
Change in the Number of People from 1990 to 2000 with Overlays



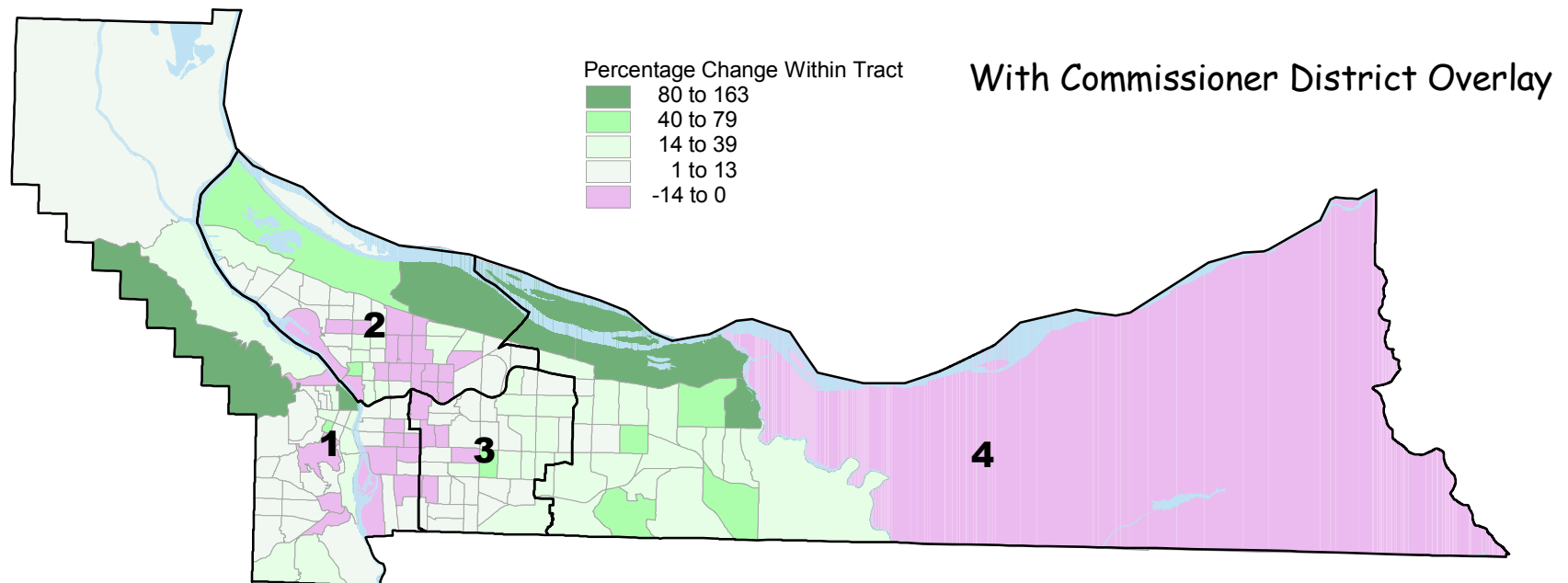
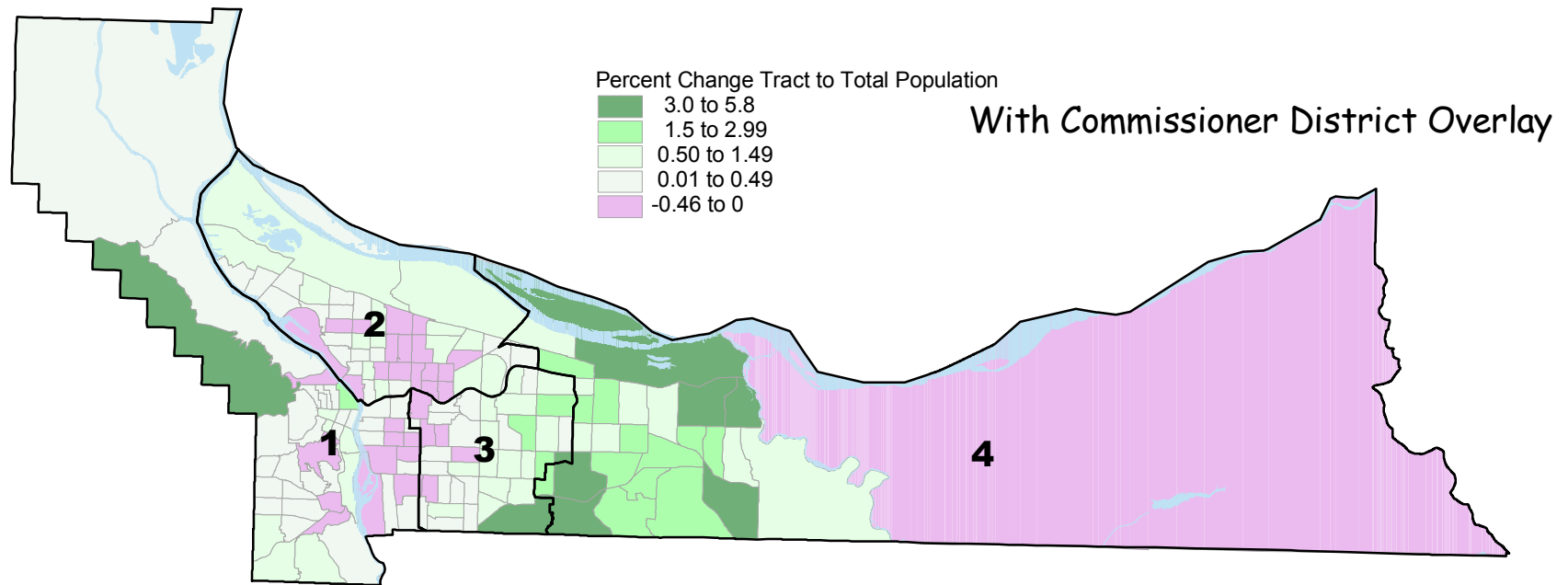
Change in the Number of People Under 18 from 1990 to 2000 with Overlays

1990 to 2000 Change in Population By Percentage with Overlays

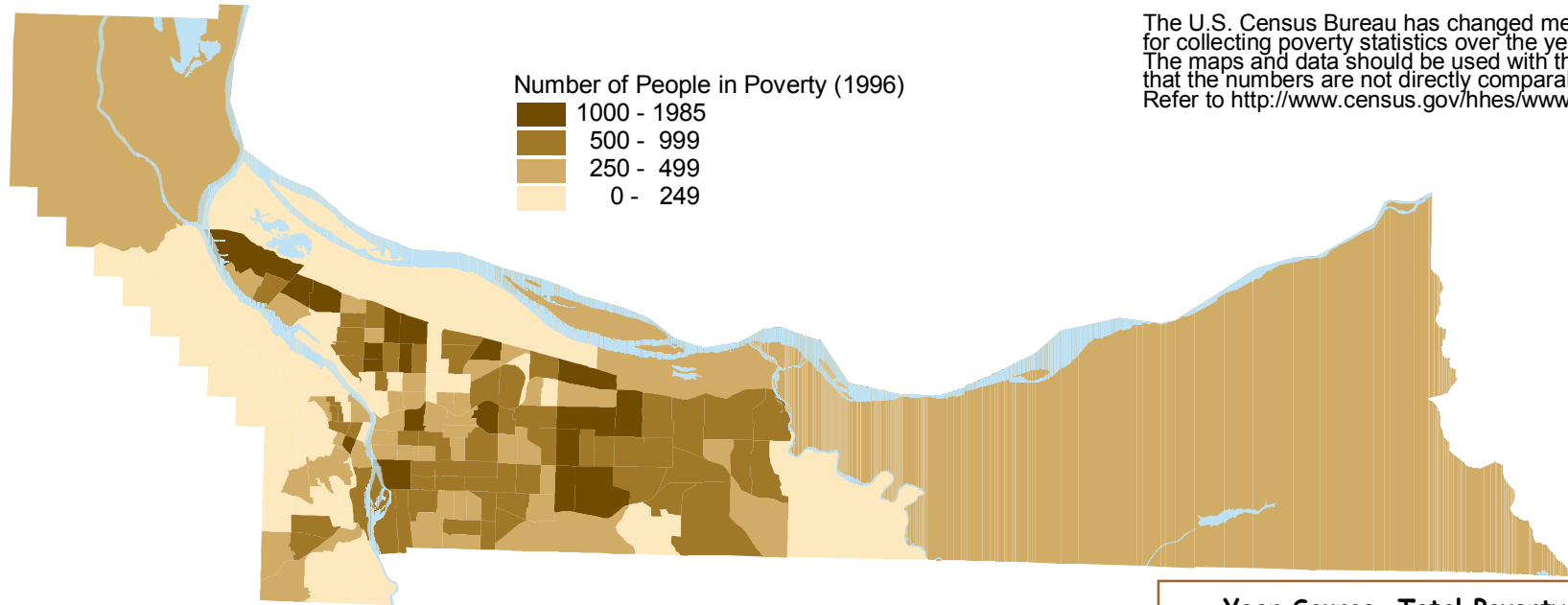
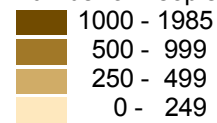

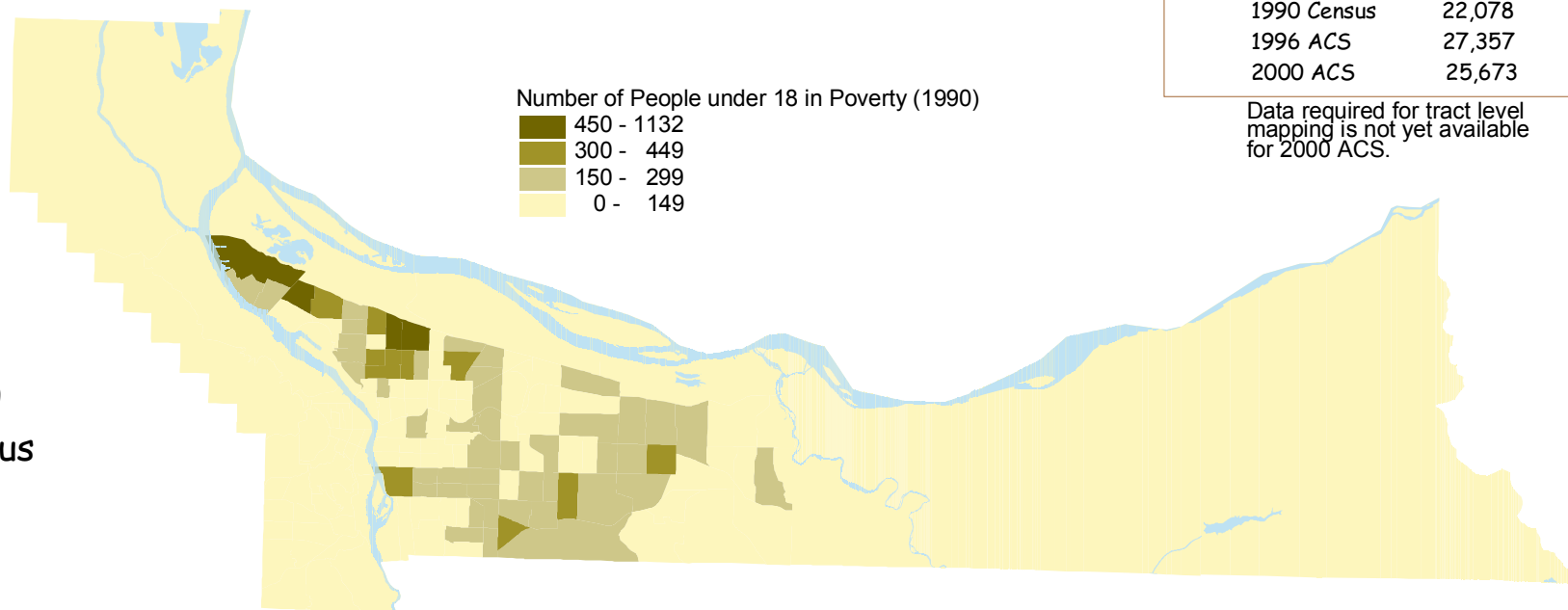

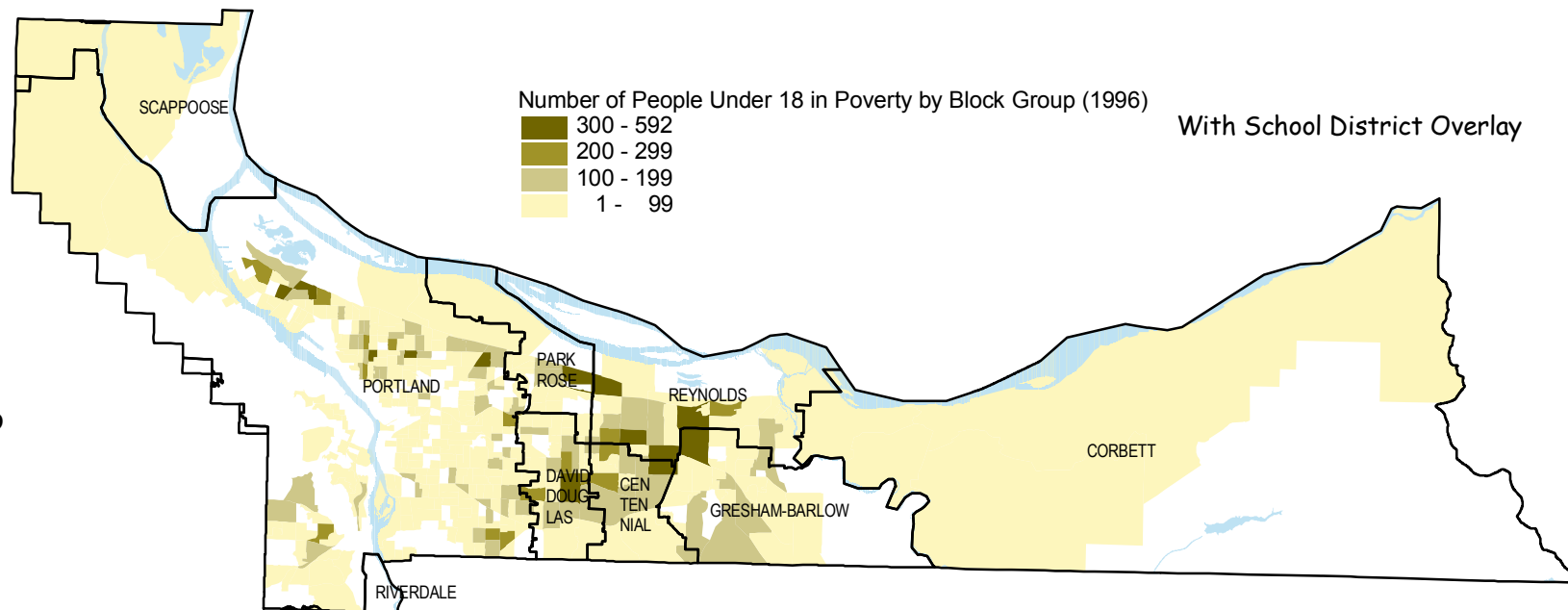

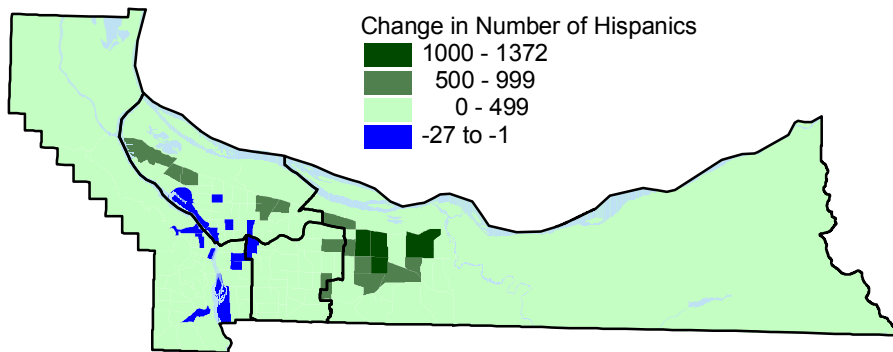

Change in Race and Ethnicity from 1990 to 2000 with Multnomah County Commissioner Districts Overlay

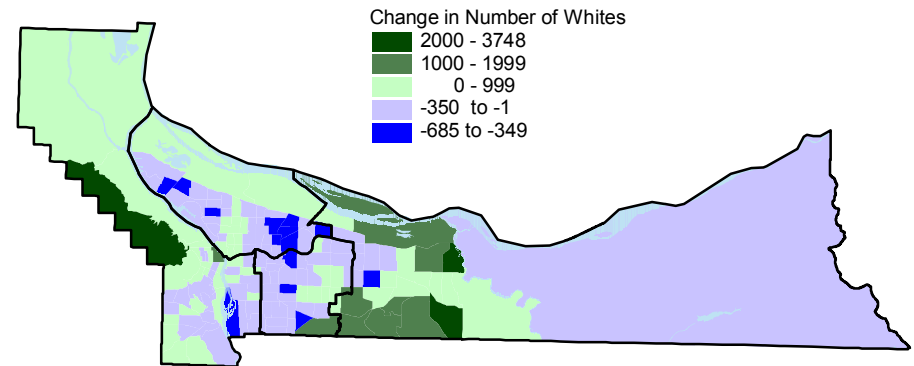

Changes in Hispanic Population



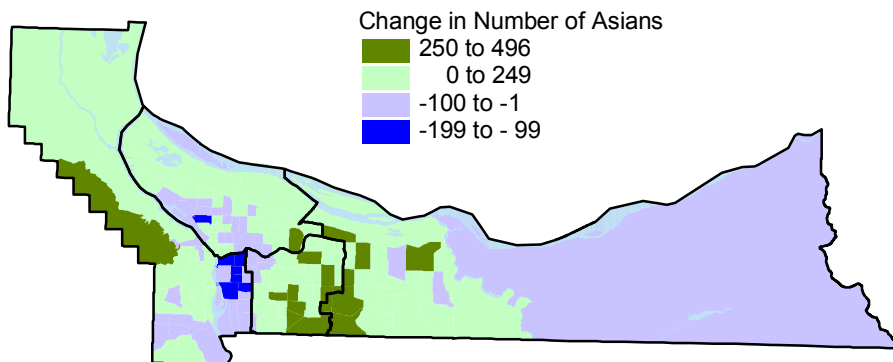

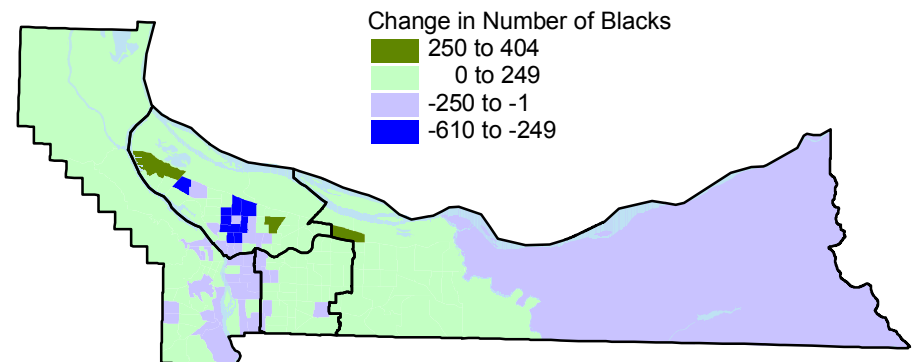

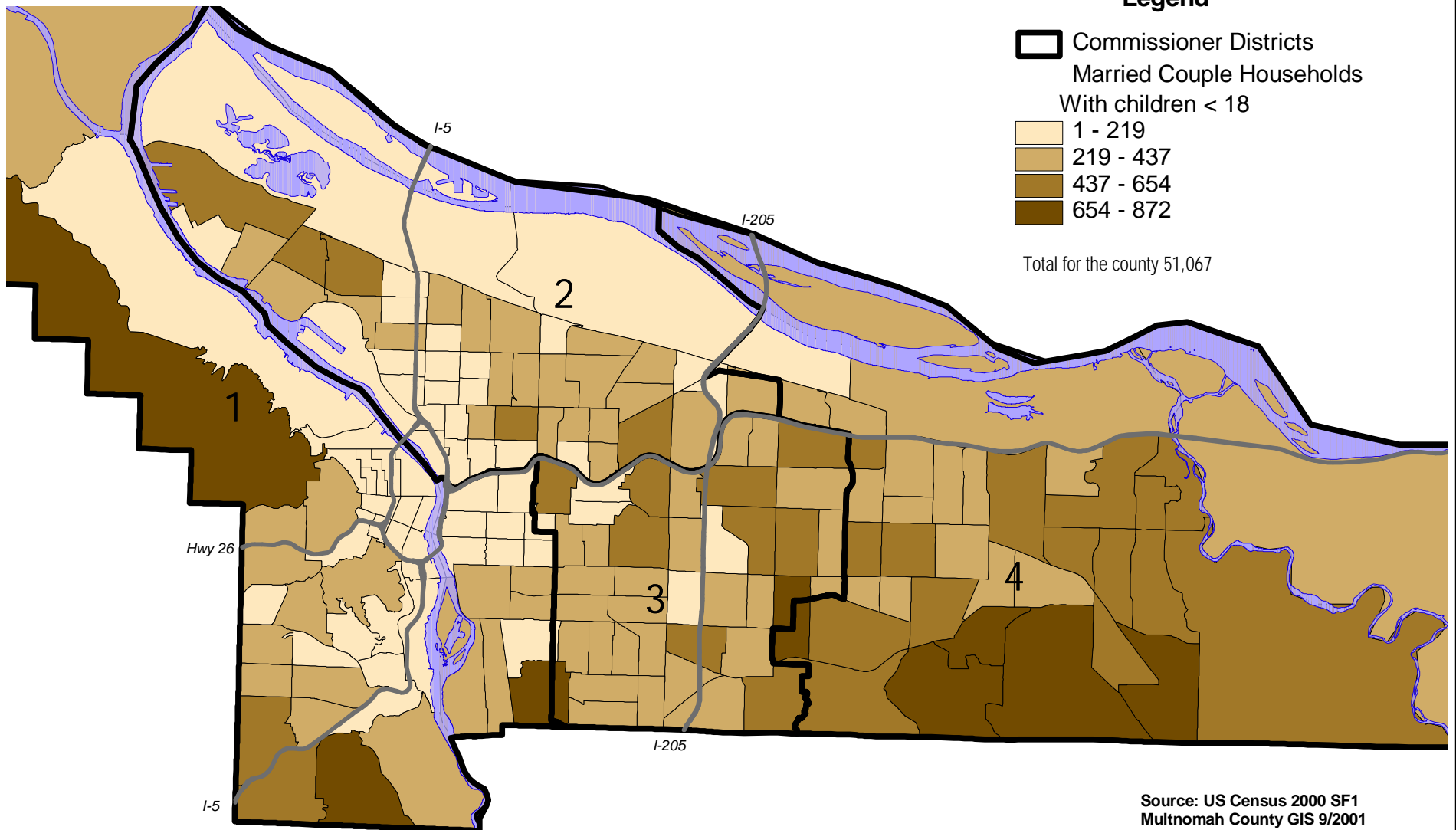

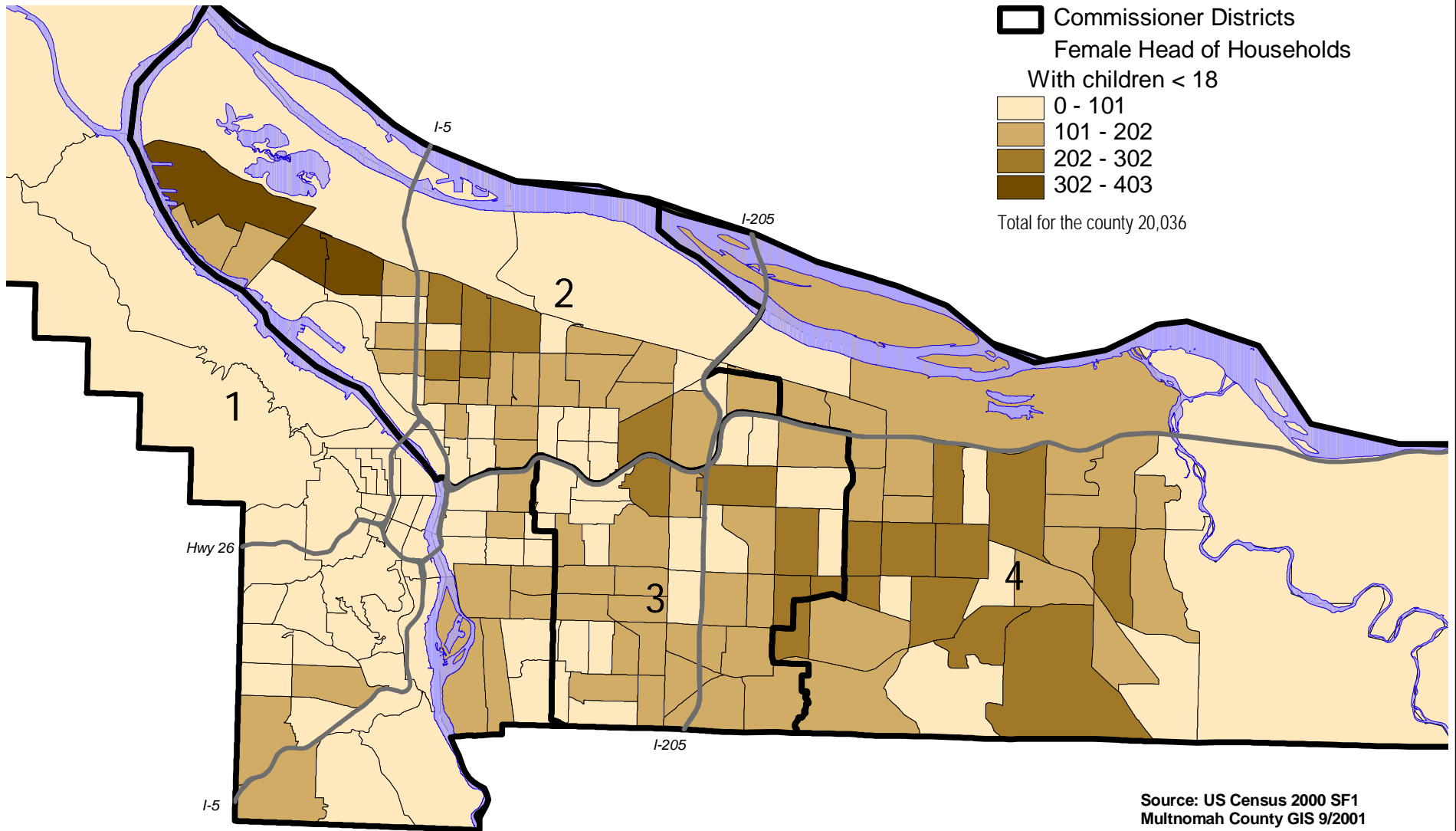

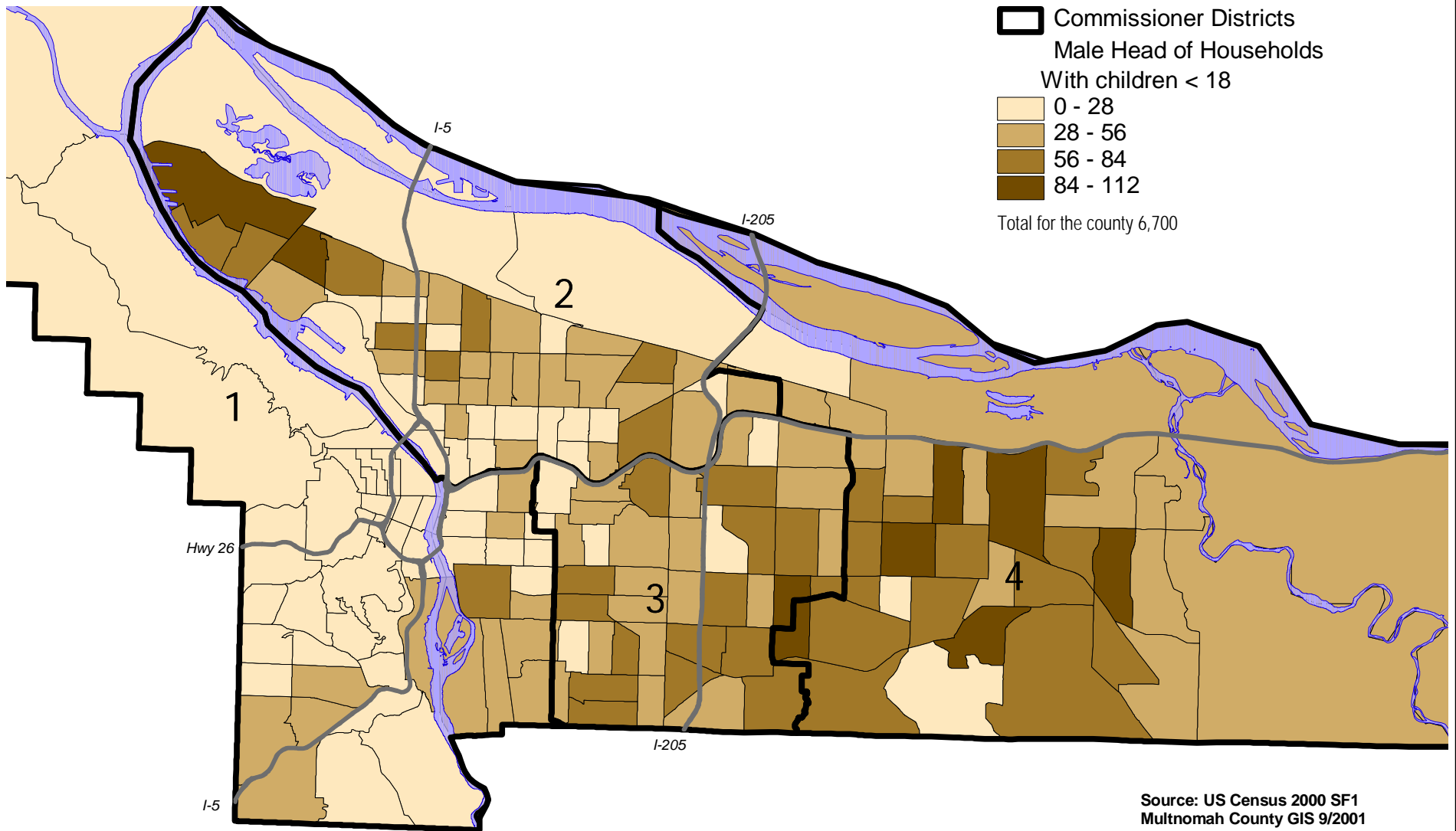
