### Changes to Forecast

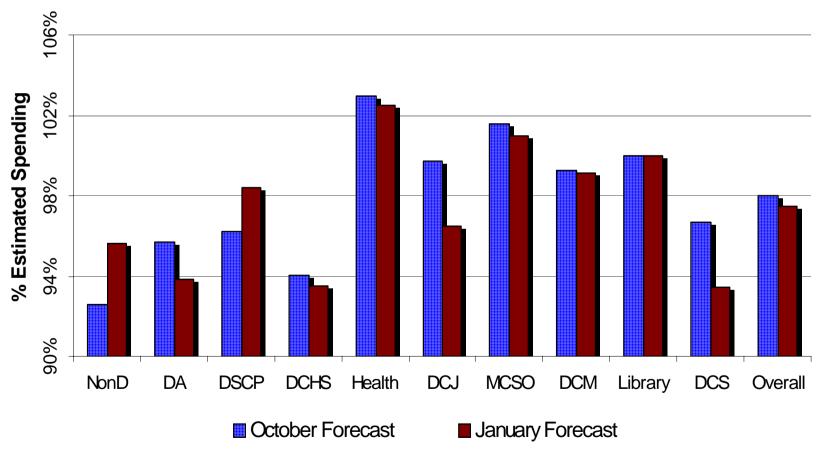
- Overall Revenue Forecast About 5% Higher Than Adopted Budget
- BIT More Than \$11 Million Higher Than Adopted Budget; Could Reach \$55 - \$57 Million
- ITAX Budget \$16.5 Million, Probably Will Only Collect About \$11 Million in FY 2007 (All Other GF)
- US Marshal per Diem Revenue Budget Assumed 125
  Beds per Day, Assumed 145 in Forecast (All Other GF)

### **Current Year Spending**

- Estimated Spending Based on Budget Office Forecast, Departments Submit CYE (Current Year Estimates) w/ Program Offers
- Overall Spending Forecast @ 97.5% to 98% of Appropriations
- Ups and Downs Are Typical of Department Spending Patterns
- Accuracy of Forecast Improves as Year Progresses
- Two Areas to Monitor Closely/Forecast Overspending
  - Health Department
  - Sheriff's Office



### Areas Forecast to Overspend

- Health Department \$1.2 to \$1.6 Million (2.5%)
  - Overall Department Spending At "Normal" Levels
  - Overspending Concentrated in Corrections Health
  - More Sick Inmates, More Serious Health Issues, More Referrals to Hospitals
  - Contingency \$1 Million for Corrections Health
- Sheriff's Office \$1.2 \$1.4 Million (1% 1.5%)
  - Programs Not Funded in FY 2007 Budget
  - Mid-Year Salary Adjustment for MCCDA Employees
  - Contingency \$1 Million for MCSO Overtime
  - Balance Could Be Made Up w/ Additional Revenues
