Focus on Family Engagement Christina McMahan Juvenile Service Division Deputy Director John Ashford Juvenile Court Counselor	Christina talked about a family panel that presented at the Juvenile Detention Alternative Initiative Conference held a few months ago in Houston, Texas. This panel was led by Grace Neal and focused on allowing family members to share their thoughts on the current state of the juvenile system around the nation. They shared national data and survey results the bottom line was asking if folks thought the current system was good enough for their children. John mentioned that parent support groups used to meet at the Juvenile Service building in the past and it was a way for the JCC to share resources but the program was disbanded due to budget cuts. He talked about another program called the "Save Our Youth" that provided skill groups for youth and families who became mentors for others in the system - but that too, was disbanded.
