Hank Stern Multco Public Affairs Coordinator	 They brought staff together and developed safety plans for all involved Rallied services around the family (i.e. housing) Worked with DHS and Sheriff to talk about the impact this death has caused both were very active participants in planning services Met with JCC's and Adult PO's to talk about gang sets across the board Developed consistent messaging and support for internal and external groups Researching GIS mapping and Facebook resources to help with case management Lessons Learned Need to keep working on a coordinated response Increase time to get services to families Need to inform community as well as staff Identify gaps in process - focus on preventive measures (i.e. working with families ahead of time) Need to develop a county webpage with community calendar and resources have folks bookmark it They will continue to respond and move forward while taking lessons from this tragedy. There will be a community meeting at Jefferson High School that is open to the public @ 6pm on December 1st. The purpose is to inform on services available and stopping the violence.
