Rob Halverson - STRYVE Grant Multco Juvenile Service Division Community Justice Manager	What gang are they a member of? What is the crime they are on supervision for? What is the area(s) they frequent? Who are their beefs? Who are their family members? Who are their strengths? What are their strengths? What are their potential needs? What is the best way to approach them? Rob Halverson discussed the details of the Striving to Reduce Youth Violence Everywhere (STRYVE) Grant they just received by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The vision of this grant is for "safe and healthy youth who can achieve their full potential as connected and contributing members of thriving, violence-free families, schools, and communities. The purpose of the grant is "to increase, among local, city, or county public health departments, the use of comprehensive youth violence prevention strategies that are based on the best available evidence." They will be focusing on the North and NE Portland areas as a pilot and will fund a couple of staff then eventually expand programming out to latino families in the East county area facilitated by the Health Department with accountability by the Youth & Gang Violence Steering Committee.
