<b>Juvenile Crime Prevention Plan (JCP)</b>  Rob Halverson Thach Nguyen Thuy Vanderlinde Rebecca Stavenjord  <b>Materials were attached to email announcement</b>	Rebecca, Rob and Thach summarized the JCP Strategic Planning Process to date, reviewed proposed strategies and activities on the plan, and led a prioritization discussion. The Council got clarification and suggested, edits, and adjusted priorities. The group also discussed the funding associated with the plan. The JCP Prevention funds pay for treatment services and cognitive-behavioral skill development, and the planning process is designed to show those services in the context of juvenile crime prevention countywide. It was also noted these funds were very limited.  The council approved moving the plan forward to the LPSCC with edits. A work plan will then be developed and discussed at a future Juvenile Justice Council.
