Hillsboro School Measure

34-355
Bonds Fixing Failing & Aging
Infrastructure; Improving Safety,
Vocational Facilities.

Question: Shall District issue bonds to increase safety, security, repair aging schools and failing infrastructure, expand vocational classrooms, secure matching funds? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary:

Lower Tax Rate:

This measure is expected to result in a bond levy rate of \$1.84 per \$1,000 assessed value - **lower than the average rate paid** since last bond approval.

If passed, District is eligible for \$6.1 million in state matching funds.

Hillsboro School District seeks approval for a principal amount of \$430 million in general obligation bonds to finance capital costs, including:

Fix Aging Buildings:

- Replace failing roofs, siding, HVAC, plumbing, flooring, and lighting.

Healthy Schools:

- Replace systems causing leaks, mold, closed classrooms.

Safety & Security:

- New doors, locks, fencing, cameras, phone systems, building automation.
- Enhance cybersecurity, network infrastructure.

Career & Technical Education:

- Update computing labs, create fire science classroom, expand STEM and vocational spaces.

Additional Projects:

- Field, track, and Title IX upgrades; bus, kitchen, fleet and aging technology replacements.

Requires community oversight committee, regular audits.

Financials:

- Bonds may be issued in multiple series, each maturing within 21 years from issuance.
- Estimated levy rate is \$1.84 per \$1,000 of assessed value.
- Actual levy rates may differ due to interest rates, changes in property value.
