1	Continue Five-Year Local Option Levy or Scappoose Fire District
■ c	Question: Shall Scappoose Fire District continue a \$1.99 per \$1,000 levy for another five years to fund essential medical/fire operations? This measure enews current local option taxes.
	The proposed measure seeks to continue a levy of \$1.99 per \$1,000 of assessed property value for the Scappoose Fire District, funding essential operating expenses from 2027 to 2031. This revenue is critical for several key services, including the continuous staffing of two ambulances 24/7 including the medications and equipment that supports response operations. The unding will ensure compliance with NFPA medical testing for firefighters. Levy funds are also used to fulfill federal and OSHA personal protective equipment testing equirements and replacement. Funds will be used for annual safety inspections and maintenance for the four fire stations. Levy funds are also used to maintain NFPA and federal compliance for emergency vehicles maintenance and eplacement when needed. Projected evenue from the levy is estimated to be 63,381,674 in 2027, \$3,483,125 in 2028, 63,587,618 in 2029, \$3,695,247 in 2030 and 63,920,287 in 2031, ensuring essential esources for community safety. The estimated tax cost is based on data from the county assessor and considers cotential early payment discounts, compression, and collection rates. Yes No
