**STIPULATED ORDER  
BETWEEN PLAINTIFF  
AND DEFENDANTS**

13 The parties hereby stipulate as follows:

14 On December 23, 2013, Plaintiff filed a Prospective Referendum Petition seeking to refer to  
15 county voters portions of an Ordinance adopted by the Multnomah County Board of  
16 Commissioners on December 19, 2013.

17 On December 31, 2013, the Multnomah County Elections Director issued a written  
18 Determination that the prospective petition did not meet constitutional requirements.

19 On January 3, 2014, Plaintiff filed a complaint in the above entitled case challenging the  
20 Director's determination.


21 Multnomah County Code §5.104(D) provides that any petition to refer legislation adopted  
22 by the Board must be submitted for signature verification not more than 90 days after the Board's  
23 adoption of such legislation. Therefore, the deadline to submit a referendum petition for signature  
24 verification is March 19, 2014.


25 In recognition of the 90 day time restriction, and the need for the parties to brief the issues  
26 raised by the Complaint for the court's consideration in making a decision in this case, the parties

1 stipulate to the court issuing an order as follows: Allowing petitioner to circulate the prospective  
2 petition for signatures prior to the court's issuance of a final decision on the merits, subject  
3 petitioner submitting a completed SEL 373, SEL 369, and confirmation from the State Elections  
4 Division that SEL 222 and 223 have been submitted, and the text of the ordinance to be referred,  
5 which will be circulated with the petition and available for inspection by petition signers.

6 This order is limited to allowing petitioner to collect signatures, and does not alter or affect  
7 any other provisions of county or state law and will not prejudice either party or their respective  
8 arguments on the legal issues presented to the court for decision.
