Bonds to Improve Health, Safety, and Learning; Modernize, Repair Schools  Question: Shall Portland Public Schools repair, modernize schools; increase health, safety; by issuing bonds estimated to maintain current tax rate?  If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.  Summary:  Measure authorizes up to \$1.83 billion in principal amount of general obligation bonds for facilities and education investments.  If approved, this measure would finance capital costs, including:  Update, Repair Aging Elementary and Middle Schools:  Update/replace major building systems, including roofs, siding, heating/cooling  Make Schools Safe and Secure:  Update safety, security systems  Seismic upgrades  Modernize, Improve Educational Materials, Technology and Schools:  Renovate/replace schools, including Cleveland, Ida B.
