The county has been working with a Community Advisory Committee to review safety issues on the road and would now like to hear input from the broader community.




Project Corridor and Hot Spot Locations

Project Overview

The safety improvements presented tonight are being evaluated using the quantitative and qualitative criteria summarized below* (not listed in any priority order):

- What is the safety benefit-to-cost ratio of the suggested improvements?
- Do suggested improvements fit within the project budget?
- Do the suggested improvements fit the crash data?
- Do suggested improvements address existing substandard elements?
- Do the suggested improvements fit within the context of the corridor?

- Do suggested improvements have the potential for adverse effects to safety, property owners (including rightof-way impacts), the environment or other factors?
- Do the suggested improvements reflect the priorities expressed by the public and CAC?
- Are there additional benefits associated with the suggested improvements?
