# **Outputs**

#### 197 youth served

67% students of color

100% identified as being "at risk of academic failure" 100% qualified for free and reduced lunch

#### 52 adults served

**142 people served** in non-enrollment events (family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

# **Outcomes**

64% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading \*
85% of students increased benchmark scores in Math \*
Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was 96%
