Respective agencies report out on budget issues	<u>DHS</u> : Projected \$5 M deficit, 30 % cuts. Some of the cuts would be: Loss of special rates for subsidized guardianships, loss of 50% medical which provides psychological evaluations for parents and after hours emergency placements. All	OYA : They have cut 10% to 12% already. Staff are taking furloughs until July 1 st . If the budget goes to the level of 30% cuts the only remaining placements will be Hillcrest, MacLaren, RiverBend and Oak Creek Facilities. State Commission: Up to 30% cuts, mostly Juvenile Crime Prevention money. 	DA : They have not filled several vacant positions to save money. There is a Dependency Grant that ends July 1 st . They are applying for many grants (like everyone else).

Discussion on how	Oregon Judicial Dept. (Judge Maurer spoke on this): Varying degree of cuts depending on the state budget. At 10% cuts they would lose all referees. There are 28 referees statewide, 14 in Mult. Co., 4 at Juvenile. Referees currently handle 1,700 dependency cases, all traffic violations and community court. At 15% there would be a loss of mental health programs and facilitators for domestic relations hearings. A 30% cut was compared to ½ time court. There are many revenue raising ideas being explored by the legislature such as vigorous collection practices and more/higher fees. DCJ (Scott Taylor spoke on this): Looking at up to a \$1.1 mil. cut in state funds, and several million dollars in county general fund. There are discussions of DCJ taking over parole supervision responsibilities from OYA. The county budget is released April 23 rd . Then it will be open for public input. Judge Waller called on the Council to begin addressing the service gaps and	If you have general questions about this
to best coordinate resources & look at systems differently Judge Waller	being proactive in our approach to using what resources we will have left, utilizing best practices. Everyone was in agreement to form workgroups There will need to be a fact finding to explore what resources are still available. It was suggested that the police be involved in these workgroups so everyone is aware of the limitations of each department. We need to provide the public with what we can do and steer the public to resources we do have rather than what we can't do anymore. When we know what the budget leaves us, we can begin these discussions.
