<p>Program Offer</p> <p>David Koch</p>	<p>Juvenile Services was invited to offer program concepts for a possible public safety levy. It was suggested to form a subcommittee under a tight timeframe, to put these concepts into a program offer. Once results are compiled from polling, it will go to commissioners for their consideration. There was a previous solicitation but what was submitted was very juvenile justice focused and we would like to address bigger issues needing attention. We want to be proactive with accountability-based answers on serious issues facing communities such as the unsocialized behaviors of youth (majority 18 years and older) which is reflected in current Tri-met issues:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Theft of services</li> <li>• Non-payment of fares</li> <li>• Truancy/school attendance</li> <li>• Underage drinking</li> <li>• Graffiti</li> <li>• Curfew violations</li> </ul> <p>A subcommittee is being formed to develop program offers that will be due in February 2008, first meeting in next week or two. This group will also look at graduated sanctions and effectiveness of case plans. 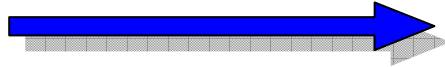
