It was suggested to form a subcommittee under a tight timeframe, to put these concepts into a program offer. Once results are compiled from polling, it will go to commissioners for their consideration. There was a previous solicitation but what was submitted was very juvenile justice focused and we would like to address bigger issues needing attention. 
