- 1. OYA service gap assessment, presented by Joe Mesteth.
 - A one-day snap shot, of both Multnomah and other Oregon youth served by OYA for April I, 2003.
 - Joe concluded that, the data speaks to an under-diagnosis, of juvenile offenders as well as, a lack of co-morbidity diagnosis.
 - Continued discussion was called for regarding, the impact of a, conduct disorder diagnosis, on service availability within Multnomah County. The impact of IQ measurement on services and the use of detention, if done at all.
 - Future data was requested regarding, race, gender, and ethnicity, for youth served by OYA, as well as, the criteria used for diagnosing the youth used in the study.
 - When will the GAIN be translated into Spanish and be applied by Spanish speaking staff.
 - A request for, the list of clinical services available to Multnomah County youth including A&D, Mental Health and services provided by OYA and DHS. To be provided at the next JJC meeting.

2. Detention population report and racial breakdown

- Future data requests include, quality control of warrants being issued, how
 violations of condition of confinement impact youth of color, percent of youth on
 conditional release, a graph showing any shifts in detention utilization trends for
 pre and post adjudicated youth broken out by race. To be presented at the next
 JJC meeting
- The group discussed the need for hiring more culturally competent and Spanish speaking staff for the residential programs.
- Granting access to youth in the residential programs by Los Hermanos and other culturally specific providers.
- Investigating best practices regarding program development for youth who have long stays in detention including BM-11 youth.
