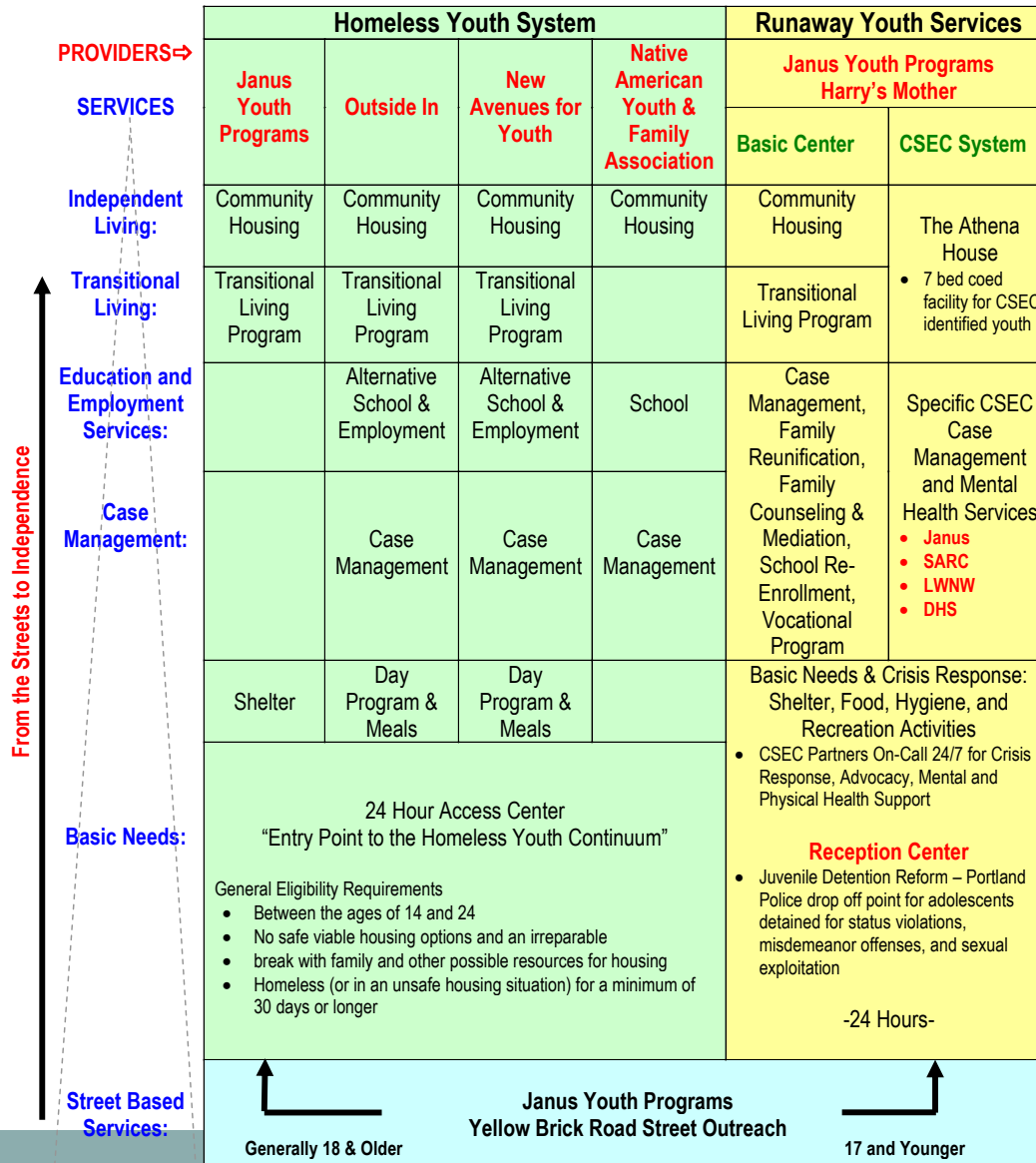
MULTNOMAH COUNTY HOMELESS YOUTH SYSTEM

Offers an integrated, multi-agency assertive engagement model that connects youth to the larger community.



- Services and supports focused on youth age 15-23
- Late stage intervention available to those most affected by continued homelessness
- Primary goals are to meet basic safety and developmental needs of homeless youth: Caring Relationships, High Expectations, Opportunities to Participate
- Four key partners:
 - Janus Youth Programs,
 - NAYA (Native American Youth & Family Services),
 - New Avenues for Youth, and
 - Outside In
- Runaway service system (Harry's Mother) available for youth under 18

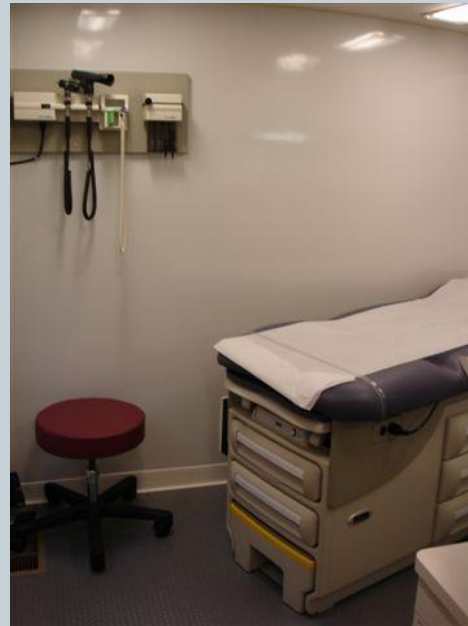

 - ✦ Offer options and let people make choices
