Multnomah County is governed by a board of four elected commissioners and one chair. More than 4,500 Multnomah County employees provide a range of services, everything from dental and medical care at our clinics, to free English conversation classes at our libraries, to senior meals through our partners at IRCO, Asian Health & Service Center and El Programa Hispano.

Budget Overview

Multnomah County's budget is \$1.4 billion each year. Most of that money comes from federal and state government. **Here's how that money is spent:**
