Program Offer #60051A-F Vent Replacements: Replace existing vent covers with a safer, suicide attempt proof vent covers.	Funded OTO
Workplace Safety/MH Liaison Sergeant: Provides a liaison with community-base mental health services, support for County staff concerned about violent actions of individuals in mental health crisis, protection for Commissioners at risk of threats of violence.	Funded by MCSO FY16
Training: Provides full funding to meet State requirements and professional best practices. Current training falls well below these levels.	Not Funded
West Side Community Resource Officer: Provides additional patrol, community safety service, and problem-solving leadership to the west side of the County. This would match services already provided to the east side. Current coverage under-supports the unique needs of County residents on the west side.	Not Funded
Domestic Violence Restraining Order Violation Gun Dispossession Deputy: Provides enforcement of court mandated orders to remove guns from RO respondents living outside of Portland. This would match current service levels provided to the residents of the City of Portland.	Not Funded



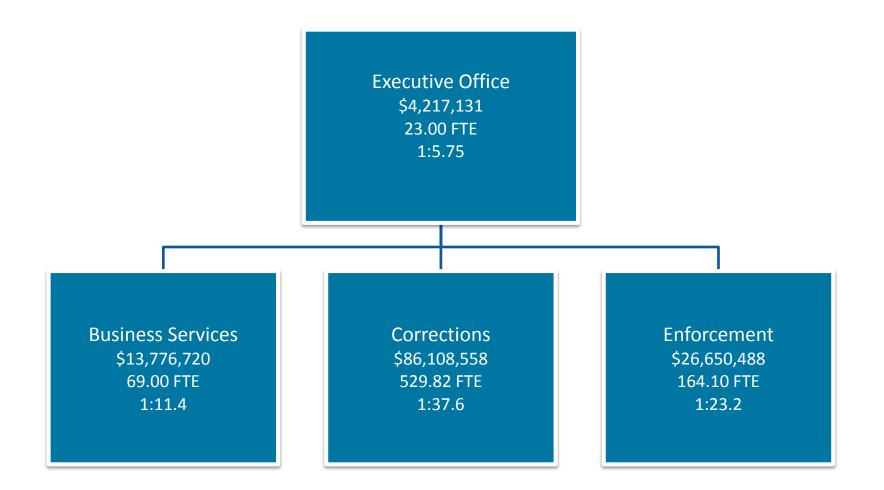

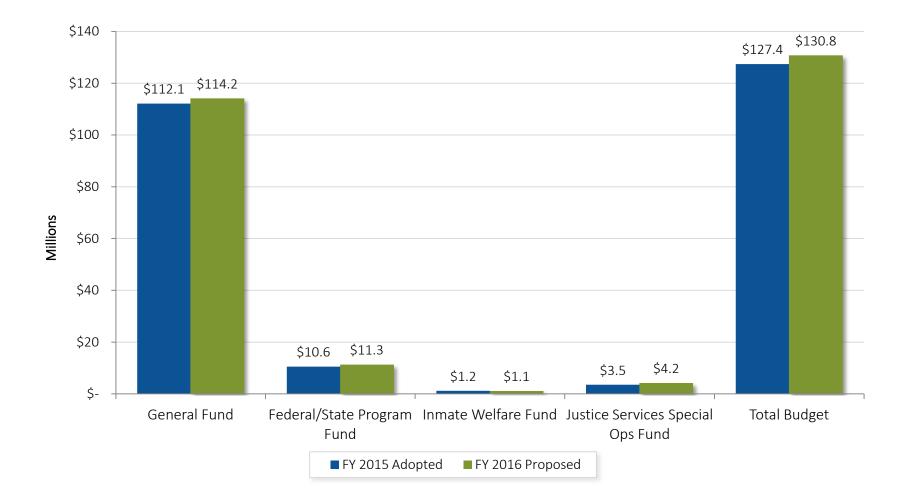
Organizational Chart





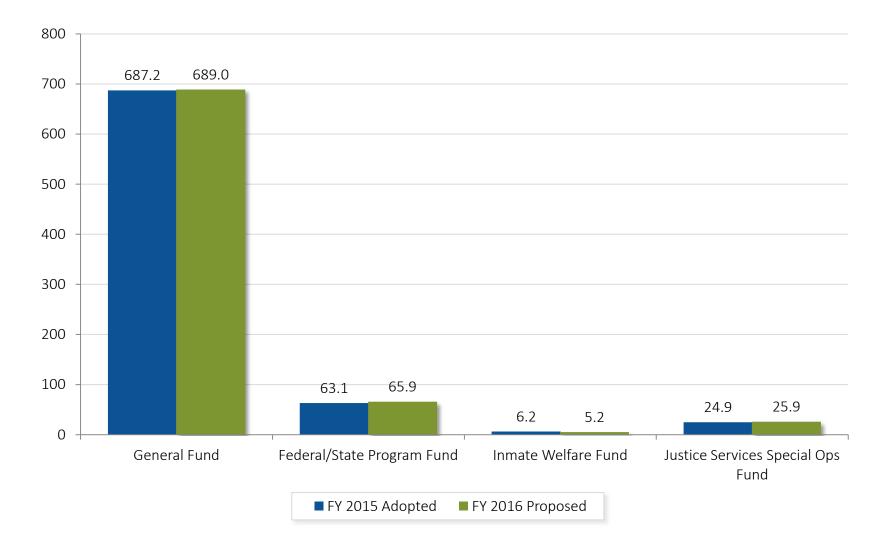
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Budget by Fund (Expenditures)





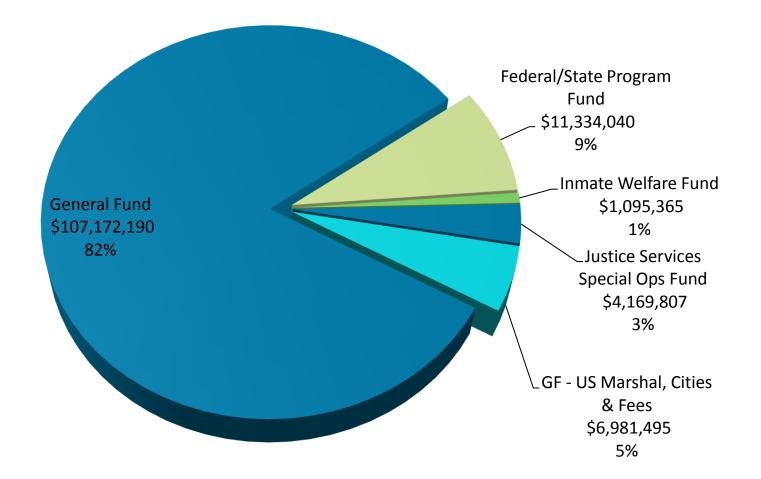
FTE by Fund





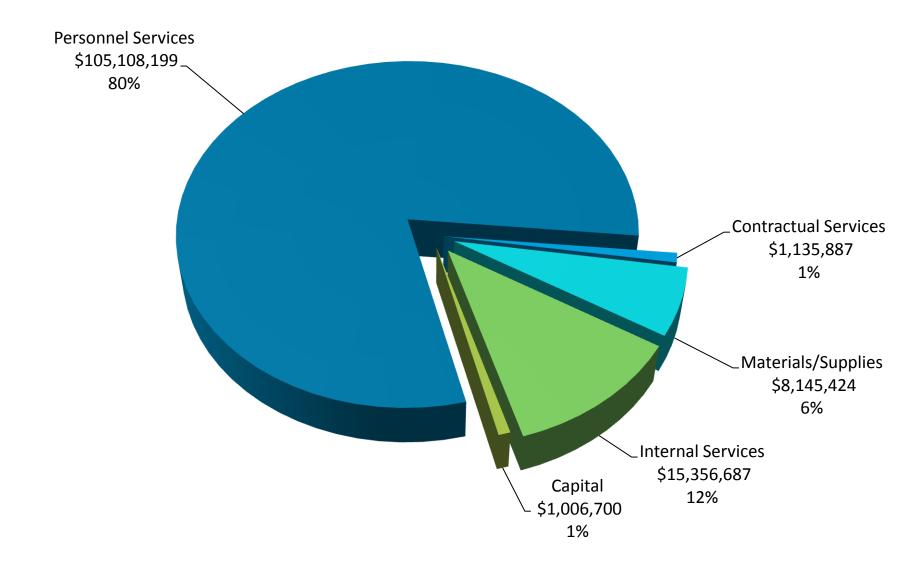
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Budget by Funding Source - \$130,752,897 (*Revenues*)





Budget by Category - \$130,752,897

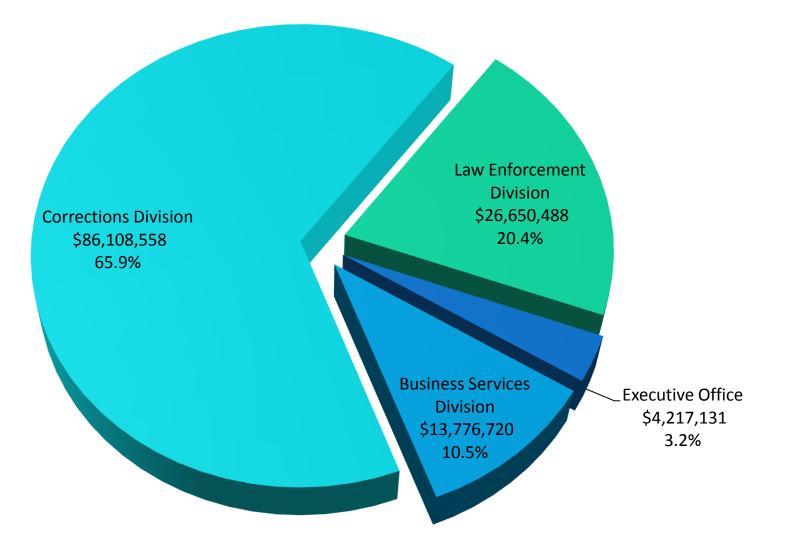

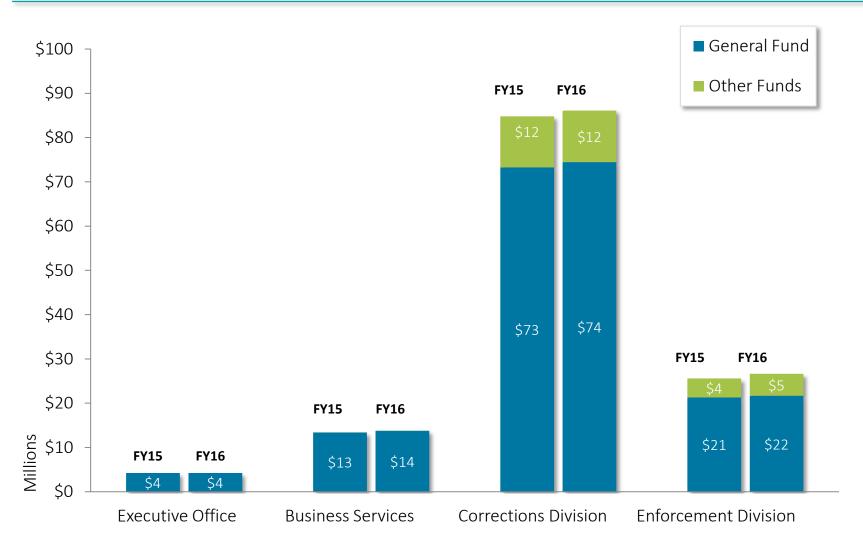

Budget by Division



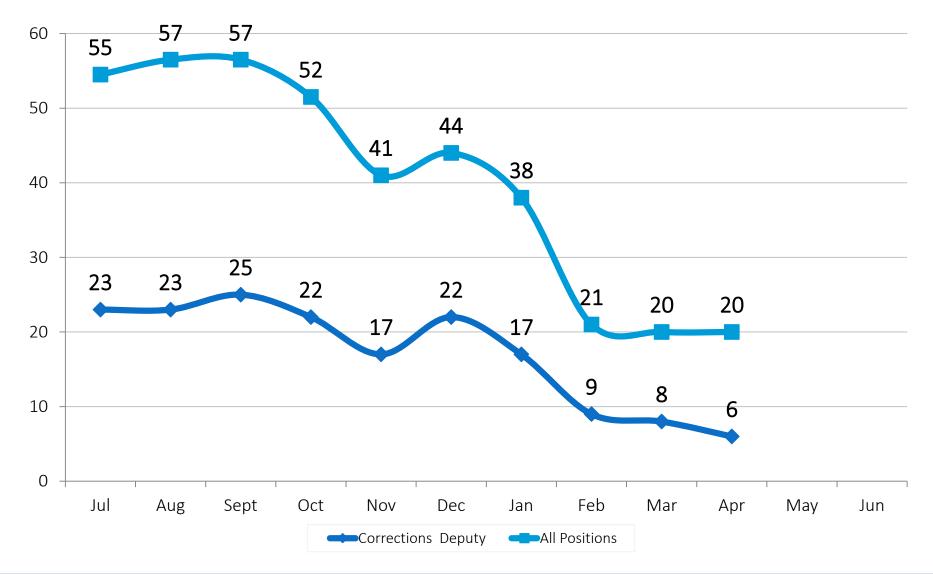


Year over Year Division by Fund



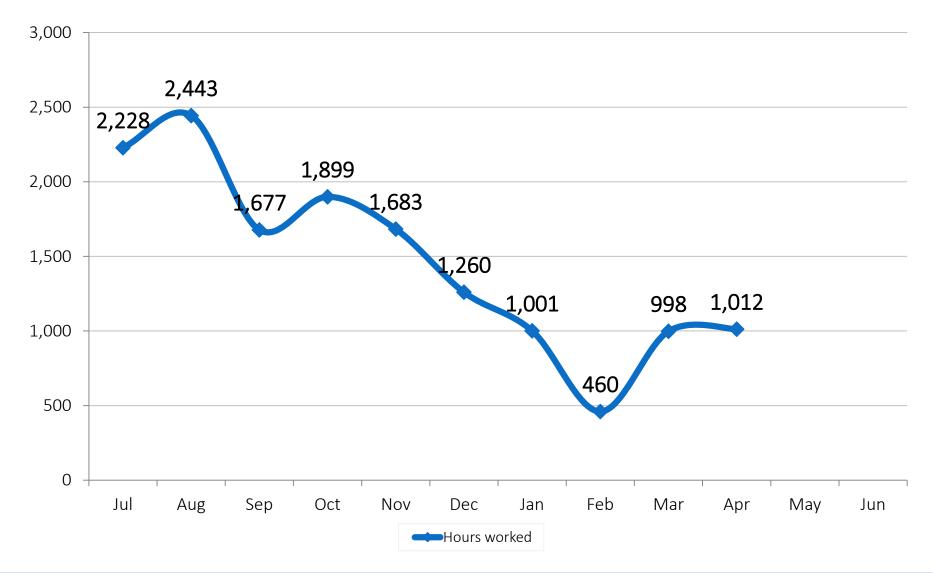


Executive Office: Total Agency Vacancies



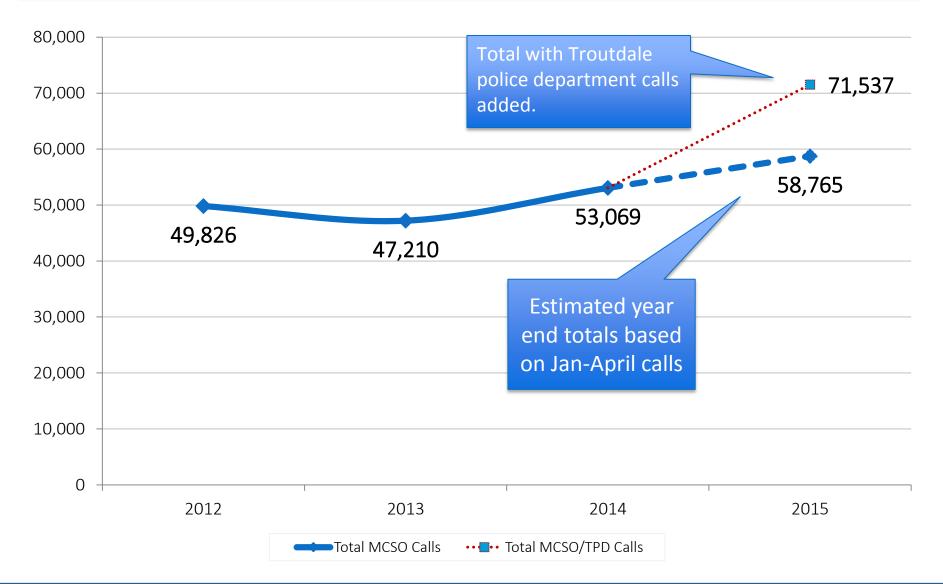


Corrections Division: Suicide Watch Hours

Mental Health Jail Diversion

- Mental Health Jail Diversion Project Recommendations
 - Recommendation A: Implement high---priority Enhancement opportunities identified by stakeholders.
 - Recommendation B: Collect and analyze data to better understand the actual costs of housing people with mental illness in the jail.
 - Recommendation C: Explore apparent racial disparities in the detention of people who have mental illness.
 - Recommendation D: Evaluate the availability of culturally specific services.
 - Recommendation E: Fill prominent system gaps.



Legislative Impacts

- State Impacts
 - Budget Assumptions
 - SB1145 in the Governor's budget increased \$300,000 over FY15
 - SB1145 in the Co-Chair's budget increased an additional \$610,000
 - Waiting for Legislature to adopt budget in June to learn the actual amount of increase
 - Potential Reductions in State Justice Reinvestment Funding (HB3194) waiting for Legislature to adopt budget in June.
 - Criminal Justice Commission Grant; DOC Measure 57; Measure 73 and State Courts funding assumed at current service levels
 - Oregon Marine Board revenue is \$42,940 less than the FY15 adopted budget
 - START Court Grant decrease of \$96,000 to Corrections Operations



Legislative Impacts

- The State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) grant is projected at \$150,000 based on the FY15 grant award which was down from previous years
- The Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) will fund a new Dive Team Support Truck to be delivered in FY16
