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Political Parties

To be established, parties must have a membership of eligible voters equal to 1.5% of votes last cast for governor, or about 21,000. Oregon has both major and minor political parties.

- Minor parties hold nominating conventions to select candidates for the general ballot. Often Oregon's minor parties nominate and support major party candidates.
- Major parties select their candidates for the general election on the ballot in the primary election. A party is a major party if it has membership of at least 5% of Oregon's registered voters or about 108,000. As of this writing, Major parties include the Oregon Republican Party, the Democratic Party of Oregon and the Independent Party of Oregon.

All Oregon primaries are closed: voters must be a member of a political party to participate in nominating candidates for partisan offices.

Multnomah County Government

Metro is the directly elected regional government that serves more than 1.5 million residents in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington counties, and the 25 cities in the Portland, Oregon, metropolitan area. The council oversees the operation of Metro's programs; develops long range plans and annual budgets; and establishes fees and other revenue measures. The Metro Council includes a council president elected region-wide and six councilors elected by district. Metro also has an auditor who is elected regionwide. Metro's responsibilities include: long-range planning; urban growth boundary management; transportation planning; waste disposal planning and management; solid waste management and recycling; preservation of natural areas; habitat restoration; venues for conventions, exhibits, and performing arts; and operating the zoo.

Multnomah County is Oregon's smallest county (465 square miles) and its most populous (748,000 residents). The cities of Fairview, Gresham, Maywood Park, Portland, Troutdale and Wood Village are in Multnomah County. The county provides services for seniors and disabled people, animal services, assessment and taxation, bridges, community justice, elections, health, jails, libraries, marriage licenses and passports, schools and community partnerships. The county also provides and maintains courthouse facilities for the Multnomah County Circuit Court.

Multnomah County Circuit Court 4th District

Multnomah County Circuit Court is the trial court for Multnomah County. Oregon's circuit courts are a division of the Oregon Judicial Branch, the third branch of Oregon's state government.

In the early 1980's, the Legislative Assembly joined the previously county-funded circuit courts into a unified state-funded court system and placed it under the authority of the Oregon Judicial Branch. Other courts included in the Oregon Judicial Branch are the Oregon Tax Court, the Oregon Court of Appeals and the Oregon Supreme Court. Oregon has three types of locally-funded courts that are not part of the Oregon Judicial Branch: county courts, justice courts, and municipal courts. Each county continues to bear responsibility for providing and maintaining courthouse facilities for the circuit court within its boundaries.

Oregon's state court system is divided into 27 judicial districts. The 4th judicial district, covering Multnomah County, has the largest number judges (38) of Oregon's 27 judicial districts.

All circuit judges are elected in nonpartisan elections for six year terms by the voters within their judicial district. The Governor may appoint a qualified person to fill midterm vacancies. An appointee who wishes to remain a judge must be elected to a full term at the next general election. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court appoints a presiding judge for each district.

Multnomah County Circuit Court is also served by 12.5 referee positions. Referees are judicial officers who serve as pro tempore (Latin for "for the time being" or temporary) circuit court judges under appointment from the Oregon Supreme Court. During their appointments they have the same authority as any other circuit court judge. Referees are employees of the Oregon Judicial Branch. Decisions made by a referee may be reviewed by a circuit court judge.

The court is also supported by senior judges under the terms of their retirement, and by several members of the local bar who are all appointed by the Chief Justice of the Oregon Supreme Court and serve as volunteer judges pro tempore.

The circuit court is a trial court of "general jurisdiction", which includes both criminal and civil matters, but excludes tax cases (tax cases are heard by the Oregon Tax Court). Criminal cases include felonies, misdemeanors, or violations of state and local laws by adults and juveniles. Civil cases include all matters that are not criminal. Examples of civil cases are small claims, family and contract disputes, personal injury cases, landlord -tenant disputes, and probate issues.

By statute (orS 3.136), the Multnomah County Circuit Court is the municipal court for the City of Portland and serves as the municipal court for the City of Gresham and other municipal governments in Multnomah County, with the exceptions of the City of Troutdale and the City of Fairview. Municipal courts have concurrent jurisdiction with circuit courts over all violations and misdemeanors (e.g., traffic violations; violations of municipal codes and ordinances; and certain minor tobacco, liquor, and drug violations). Municipal courts do not have jurisdiction over felonies.

Criminal and Civil Judges

The judges assigned to Criminal and Civil Court hear all criminal cases (misdemeanors and felonies), as well as infractions and traffic violations. They also hear civil actions (lawsuits), including small claims and landlord/tenant disputes.

Family and Juvenile Judges

The judges assigned to Family Court hear all domestic relations (divorce and child custody) cases, juvenile court matters (dependency, delinquency, and termination of parental rights), as well as probate and civil commitment cases. Family Court judges also hear misdemeanor criminal cases scheduled in Domestic Violence Court.

Criminal and Civil Referees

Referees usually sit in the following courts: small claims; landlord and tenant; civil commitments; traffic arraignments and trials; and the Justice Center Courts. They may occasionally have other assignments. The referees also preside over misdemeanor criminal cases, including jury trials, in the East County Courthouse.

Family and Juvenile Referees

Referees also serve in the Family Court. The referees usually hear the following matters: juvenile dependency, juvenile law violation (delinquency), probate, family abuse restraining orders, civil commitments, and other family law matters.

Elections Information, Cont.

Registering to Vote

Individuals must meet all three of the following qualifications:

- You must be a resident of Oregon.
- You must be a United States citizen.
- You must be at least 17 years old.

A person who has been convicted of a crime, if otherwise qualified, can register to vote unless the person is currently serving a jail or prison sentence for a felony conviction. Homeless individuals, if otherwise qualified, are eligible to vote.

Where can I register to vote?

- Online: If you have a valid Oregon Drivers License or ID, at <u>oregonvotes.gov</u>
- In Person: At any County Elections office or Department of Motor Vehicles office
- By Mail: Registration forms are available at county libraries, US post offices and online at <u>mcelections.org</u>. Complete and sign the form and mail to the Elections Office.

The last day to register to vote is 21 days before election day.

Registration Updates

A new registration is required to:

- Change your home or mailing address
- Change your name
- Select or change your political party

Update by filling out a new voter registration card and mailing it to your local elections office or by going online to <u>oregonvotes.org</u> or <u>mcelections.org</u>.

Vote by Mail

All elections in Oregon are conducted vote-by-mail. A ballot is mailed to each registered voter two to three weeks before the election. The voter marks the ballot, places it in the secrecy envelope (optional) and then in the return envelope. The voter must sign the return envelope for the ballot to be counted. The voter may (1) return it by mail; (2) deliver it to any official drop site in Oregon; or (3) deliver it in person to any elections office in Oregon. Ballots must be placed in an official drop box or received in an elections office by 8:00 pm on election day to be counted.

Absentee Ballots

If the voter will be away from home when ballots are mailed, an absentee ballot may be requested at <u>mcelections.org</u> or picked up at any Election Office as soon as available for early voting.

Elections in Oregon

There are two regularly scheduled statewide elections in even-numbered years: the Primary Election in May and the General Election in November. The legislature may call a Special Election at any time. District elections are held at various times.

Oregon voters select a party affiliation at time of voter registration and this influences the primary ballot the voter receives. Primary elections contain both partisan (associated with a party) and nonpartisan races.

- 1. The partisan Primary Election determines who will represent the party in the General Election. Only voters affiliated with one of the three major parties receive a partisan ballot, either Republican, Democratic or Independent, to select the candidates who will represent the party in the General Election. An exception to this rule can be made if a party chooses to open its primary to non-affiliated voters.
- 2. Many locally elected positions and Oregon's judges are nonpartisan offices. Every voter can participate in the primary elections for those offices. In most cases, if a candidate for nonpartisan office receives a majority of votes cast for the office in the Primary Election, that candidate is elected. If no candidate for the office receives a majority of the votes cast, the two candidates with the highest number of votes will appear on the November General Election ballot.

In the General Election, all voters receive ballots with all races (partisan and nonpartisan), ballot measures and referendums for their precinct, city, and county.

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Initiative and Referendum

The initiative and referendum process is a system of direct government by the people. An initiative allows citizens to directly propose a law or a constitutional amendment to be voted upon by the electorate. A referendum allows voters to accept or reject a law or constitutional amendment passed or proposed by the State Legislature. The Legislature *must* refer measures to the people in the case of constitutional amendments, tax levies and bond issues. In other cases, the Legislature may refer legislation. Citizens may file referendum petitions.

To start an initiative or referendum process, you must file the appropriate paperwork to begin the process. Supporters must then obtain signatures from registered voters. The number of signatures needed is a fixed percentage based on votes cast for Governor in the preceding election.
