High risk offenders will be treated in separate groups, and will receive interventions from Moral Reconciliation Therapy and the Psychology of Criminal Behavior. In addition, clients will attend Early Recovery, Relapse Prevention, and Personal Effectiveness groups which are integrated into the general treatment curriculum. Culturally specific programming in MRT will be available for African American men.</p>

Confrontation of beliefs, attitudes and behaviors 2. Assessment of current relationships 3. Reinforcement of positive behavior and habits 4. Positive identity formation 5. Enhancement of self-concept 6. Decrease in hedonism and development of frustration tolerance 7. Development of higher stages of moral reasoning</p> <p>The client will also receive at least one additional group session per week and monthly individual therapy which will include addressing criminogenic risk factors.</p>
